Editor "Cariboo Observer".
Dear Sir:-
That the Beaver season is not to be opened this year was indeed bad news for the Indians of the North, and no wonder, with the other fur bearing animals pretty well trapped out, and the tens of thousands of Beaver on the upper Fraser, Bear, and Willow Rivers it seems ridiculous and uncalled for to restrict the Indians from hunting them.
In the inland lakes Beaver are practically extinct now, but on the creeks and on the upper reaches of the rivers they are as plentiful as they were twenty years ago. Beaver, outside of Lynx is the one fur bearer that supplies both food and money for the red man. No one except those familiar with the Indians realize what this restriction means to them. Of course there has been a big catch of salmon but salmon straight becomes not only unpalatable but unwholesome.
Surely when twenty years of hunting has not reduced the number of animals which undoubtedly retard the country agriculturally, the powers that be might surely regard the beaver in the light of heritage to those who were monarchs of all they surveyed in this North land, and grant them the privilege of hunting them.
They will be hunted anyway and their pelts burned as the Indian must eat as well as his white brother also he must have a change of food from time to time and the other necessities of life.
