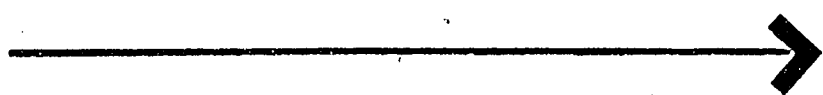

Interest in Exhibition is Growing

As the date set for the first exhibition of agricultural products held in this section draws near, the secretary is constantly in receipt of information telling of the great interest aroused in all sections and of the intention to send in exhibits. From Soda Creek and intermediate points, Barkerville and Blackwater, as well as the surrounding district, come assurances that exhibits will be sent in, and this despite the fact that no cash prizes have been offered.

During the past week the secretary has received a communication from the acting secretary of the Department of Agriculture, Victoria, enclosing the necessary forms to fill out in order to form an Agricultural Association here. A communication was also received from Hon. Price Ellison, Minister of Agriculture, expressing his pleasure at the efforts being made to exploit the agricultural possibilities of the district, and enclosing a cheque for \$250. Mr. Ellison also promised that if it was possible an expert would be sent to judge the exhibits, and has also graciously consented to sign the diplomas.

The meeting adjourned at 10.00.

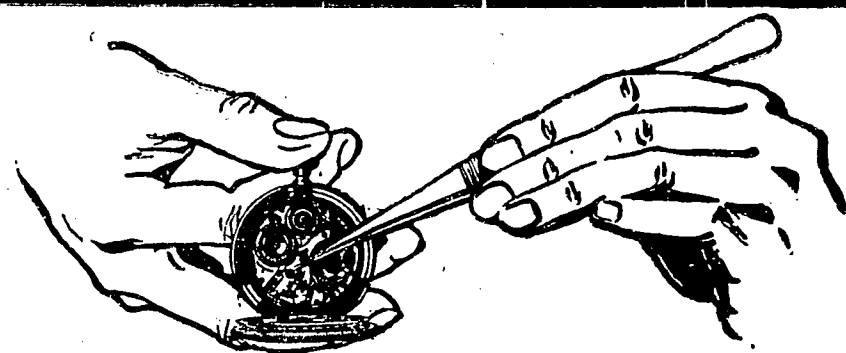
