Only a nominal entrance fee will be charged and the usual enjoyable evening that one has learned to expect from a visit to Kersley is assured.

To return to Saturday evening the curtain rose promptly at 9 p.m. for the Negro sketch "What's the Groom?" and for the next two hours the audience were kept in rous of laughter. For the Housewife

People are always delighted to be invited to Sunday night supper. It's not that they anticipate a huge spread, but the hospitality which inspires the invitation is gratifying. It is a form of entertaining which is easy on the hostess as well. The following recipes may help to make these suppers delightful.

Magic Mayonnaise 1-4 cup vinegar or lemon juice, 1-4 cup salad oil or melted butter, 2-3 cup sweetened condensed milk, 1 egg yolk (unbeaten); 1-2 teaspoon salt, Few grains cayenne, 1 teaspoon dry mustard.

Place ingredients in a pint jar in the order listed. Fasten top on jar and shake vigorously for two minutes. The mixture will blend perfectly. If thicker consistency is desired, place jar in refrigerator to chill before serving. (This mayonnaise may also be made by stirring ingredients together in a bowl.) Makes 1 and 1-4 cups. This mayonnaise will carry an additional cup of oil if this flavor is particularly liked. The vinegar may also be increased up to 1-2 cup.

Lemon Meringue Pie 1-3 cups sweetened condensed milk, 1-2 cup lemon juice. Grated rind of 1 lemon or 1-4 teaspoon lemon extract, 2 eggs, 2 tablespoons granulated sugar, Baked pie shell or unbaked crumb crust.

Blend together sweetened condensed milk, lemon juice, grated lemon rind or lemon extract, and egg yolks. Pour into baked pie shell or unbaked crumb crust. Cover with

Unbaked Crumb Crust Blend 1 cup crumbs (graham, crackers, toasted graham bread or lemon snaps), a few grains of salt and 1-4 cup sweetened condensed milk. Butter pie plate and line by pressing mixture in firmly. Pour in pie filling; top with meringue and bake until meringue is a delicate brown. Use this crust only when meringue is used. In browning meringue, this crust is baked sufficiently.

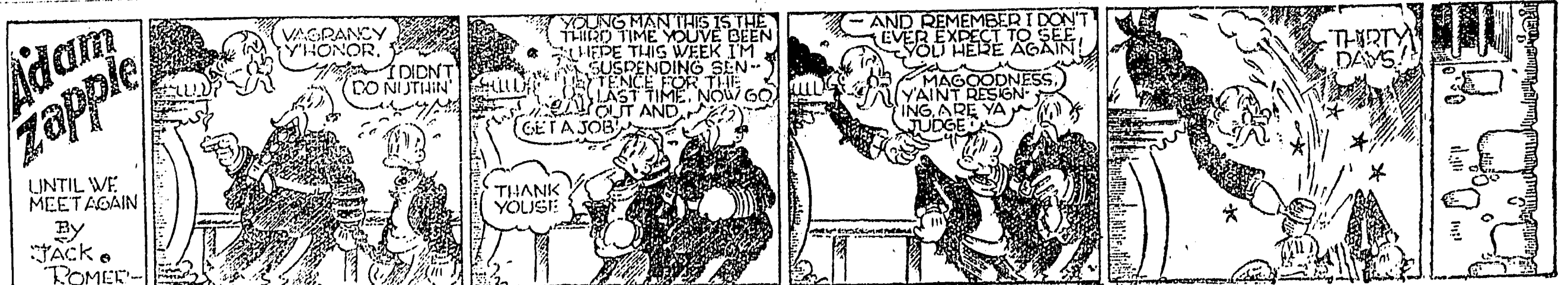

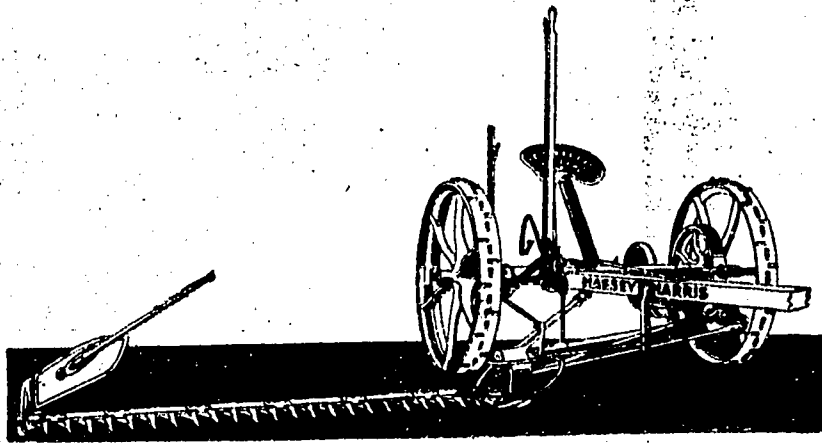

The warm weather and a mistaken idea that here in the Cariboo there is gold and work for the asking, have brought a large number of transients in to the district in the last few days. As things are at present, there are two men for every job and very little hope for the outsider entering the country for the first time. True, providing that a man has a grub stake and is possessed of a certain amount of knowledge, there is always a living to be made by working the bars and benches. However, for anyone straight from the city who has never seen a gold pan or a rocker before or who is not prepared to work harder than he has ever worked before, there is not very much hope of making wages. At the present time, also, owing to the exceptionally high water in the streams and rivers the small placer miners are being driven away from their workings.
