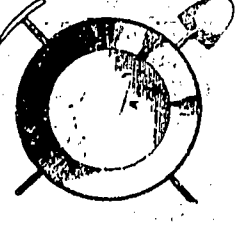

MINING NOTES

GOLD BRICK 730 OUNCES

Monthly reports from the Cariboo Gold Quartz property gives a gold production for the month of May amounting to seven hundred and thirty ounces of the yellow metal. This recovery was all made from development ore as the management has not yet started to stope and is looked upon as a very satisfactory showing under the circumstances.

Ore values are not changed in any appreciable extent from former months and considerable developed ore has been added to the blocked out reserves.

BIG DREDGE TO WORK FRASER RIVER

For years mining men have known that the gravels and bars of the Fraser River for a distance of more than four hundred miles contain placer gold. In the early days many of these bars were washed to a water level line and literally millions of dollars were recovered from purely surface workings.

Convinced that gold can be recovered on a large scale from the bed of the Fraser, the Fraser River Golds Co. Ltd. has decided to dredge the bed of the river and to that end are building a mighty dredge of the most modern design. The first unit is now nearing completion at the works of the B.C. Marine Engineering Works of Vancouver at a cost of more than \$10,000.00. The dredge will be, when completed, 140 feet in length and 42 feet in width with a power plant that will develop 2000 h.p. or an excess of what will be required for its operation.

Construction of the dredge was started only after a careful investigation of the pay gravels of the Fraser had been made through the use of Keystone drills, and actual washing of measured yards of gravel at various points along the river.

Drilling operations show that bedrock is from 30 to 90 feet below the surface and that the gravel carries values ranging from 19.2 to 70.9 cents with gold at the old valuation of \$20.67. The Fraser River Golds Ltd. originally had staked some thirty miles of the Fraser River from Union Bar, three miles above Hope to Chilliwack, but since finishing their preliminary prospecting and carefully checking the results, they have staked and optioned ground as far as Quesnel, a distance of some 400 miles. In this location they have many portions that will in all probability be hydraulicked, but plan on working the bulk of the yardage with dredges.

AL HARRIS AT WORK ON TERTIARY

Al Harris, well-known old time mining man and prospector who has been devoting his time for the past several years to the Tertiary Mine located in Cottonwood Canyon some twenty miles above this city, has finally convinced himself that he has in this property one of the old channels of the famous Cariboo District. In this development he has been running bedrock drains, trenching and generally sampling and now states that he has a tremendous yardage of gravel that will run three dollars to the cubic yard. This yardage has been exposed and demonstrated by a drift and arrangements are being made to work the deposit.

BALL MILL BEING TAKEN TO TASEKO LAKE

The Straub Ball mill destined for the Taylor-Windfall Gold Mining Company with property on Taseko Lake, has arrived at this point and will be taken into the property by plane landing on Taseko Lake.

Manager Chisholm Fraser states that he will have the mill set up and in operation early in July. A crew of twenty five men are at work on the property and a development plan of diamond drilling was started this week. It is reported that after penetrating the rich surface showing, good commercial values were found at a depth of thirty feet although details and values are not available at this time. Some phenomenally rich samples from the surface have been brought out and are exciting considerable interest. The samples that have been shown are of a dark brown conglomerate, and are literally "shot full of free gold". Assays as high as \$1500.00 per ton have been reported.

Mr. A. Peeling, Superintendent of the Keithley-Brechlin Mines, reports that satisfactory results are being obtained from the plan of development that is being pursued on the subsidiary of the Keithley Consolidated Gold Mines Ltd. property. Their Number 1 tunnel has shown up a strongly mineralized vein showing a width of approximately

fifty feet. This vein has been stripped on the surface for a distance of more than three thousand feet. Some of the samples taken from this vein show free gold visible to the naked eye. This property is located on the Hixon-Keithley mineralized zone of the Cariboo District of British Columbia near Cariboo Lake.
