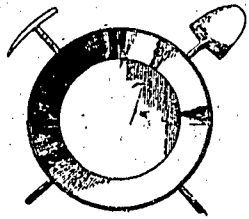

**MINING NOTES**

**TO EXPLORE QUESNELLE QUARTZ**

At Hixon Creek, the Quesnelle Quartz Mining Co. Ltd., will speed up the exploration of the mineral zone where in the early days rich ore was obtained. Machinery has been installed, and under the supervision of P. E. Peterson, mining engineer, has been steadily carried on. At the camp work has been done to put everything up to date, and the old main shaft has been un-watered. It is understood that the main stringer which runs under the Briscoe pit is widening and that a vein has been struck nearly four feet in width with some free gold showing. It is expected that the work will disclose at the contact zone some rich ore, also that the company will drive a tunnel from the shaft to cut the Koch vein at depth.

**CARIBOO GOLD QUARTZ MILLING INCREASED**

At the Cariboo Gold Quartz Mine the production during the month of August was 1337 ounces of gold approximately valued at \$45,000. During the month the mill was operating at about 80% of its capacity, owing to a stop of a few days while the process of stepping up to 100 tons was completed. With the increased capacity it is expected the month of September will create a new record. The underground work is proceeding at a rapid rate and now that the main tunnel has reached the objective area to be developed it is expected that much greater progress will be shown.

**GUTHRIE MINE TO DRIVE TUNNEL**

It is reported that the Eskridge Syndicate No. 2 has let a contract for 200 feet of tunnel on the claim known as the Willow of the Guthrie Group. The syndicate hold some 15 claims and other fractions. The property has been held by Harry Guthrie for about 18 years, who was attracted by the open cuts and some tunnels driven by the old time prospectors. He also has done a large amount of surface cross-cutting on a good sized vein carrying sulphides. We understand the tunnel to be driven in to cross-cut No. 5 vein, which appears to be the largest of a parallel system, and on the surface above the width is about eight feet. It is believed that this tunnel should also cut other veins of good width. Some of these veins have produced ore carrying good values in gold, while some of the others run high in silver, lead and zinc.

**MCDUGALL CREEK PLACER**

About 25 men are busily employed under the management of F. B. Chettleburgh testing placer ground on McDougall Creek, which is a tributary of the McLeod river, about 100 miles north of Prince George. The company is known as the Northern Reef Gold Mines, and has already expended about \$12,000 last season and expects to spend another \$25,000 this season in testing thoroughly the gravel yardage. The holdings consist of 6 placer leases and about 12 mineral claims, but the quartz prospecting will not be carried on this season. No true quartz has yet been found in the ledges, but gold values have been found in the conglomerate making up the ledge matter and the company hope that prospecting will reveal commercial values.

**ACTIVITY MARKED THROUGHOUT THE CARIBOO**

(Western Canada Mining - Barkerville) - Now that the placer season is well on, increasing interest is being taken in properties not only in the Barkerville area, but throughout the whole district. It is not the roaring placer camp of the sixties, where open-handed miners tossed their bulging pokes on the bar and called for drinks for the house, but it is a modern camp—a hard rock camp where modern methods and machinery are beginning to mine the gold that has for years so long lain hidden in the great ledges of mineralized quartz that once gave up enough of their

surplus to make the placer camp that was Cariboo.

Instead of the roistering red-shirted placer miner with his pick and shovel on his back panning the bars of various streams, we now have the keen eyed university-trained mining engineer and geologist looking for prospects. There is no scarcity of money to develop any "showing" that this man may see, examine and recommend—he has the backing and is only looking for something that he can recommend to his people, and he is finding it in Cariboo. From way over to the Cottonwood, up the length of Lightning Creek, through Devil's Canyon and round Jack of Clubs Lake and up past the head of Williams Creek and down the Keithley to Cariboo Lake, new dumps are showing. They are not the gravel placer dumps of an age gone by, but the robin's egg blue of the hard rock richfield formation that tells of long tunnels being driven in to tap the golden heart of the Cariboo.

In Ontario the operations of mining syndicates are being curtailed on account of the ruling that when syndicates sell their holdings and take profits in shares or cash in any new company formed to take over the property, unit holders are liable for the regular income tax rate upon those profits.

**C. P. R. EARNINGS**

An increase of 53 per cent in net earnings during the first seven months of the year, compared with the corresponding period of 1933, is an excellent indication of improvement of general business conditions in Canada.

**FOR THE FARMER**

Making Hay—"Don't make hay in the sunshine" reverses the old adage. Scientists declare sun dried hay loses a third of its starch and protein and artificial drying is preferable. Under the circumstances it may now be possible for the farmers to come under the eight hour day act.

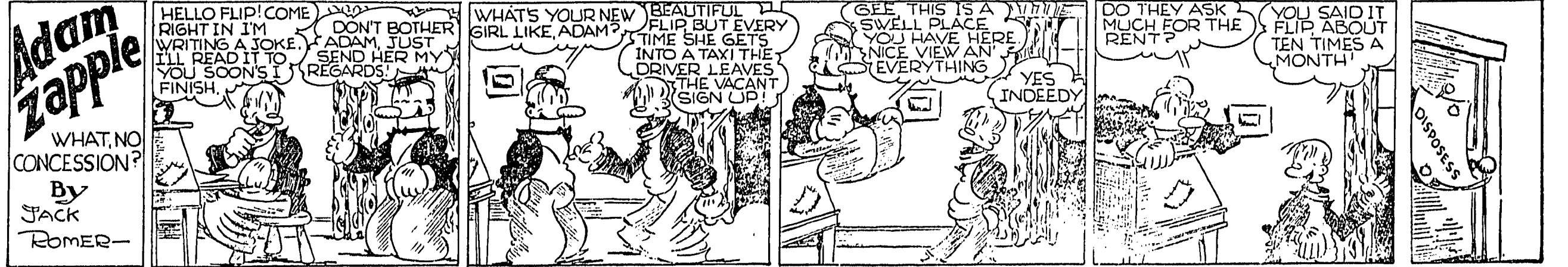

### KERSLEY FARMERS' INSTITUTE

On Saturday night last at Kersley, Mr. H. S. Macleod, Chief Inspector of Certified Seed Potatoes, gave an interesting address, during which he stressed the importance of the seed planted and that each grower should maintain a seed plot planting it by the tuber unit method. The easiest and most satisfactory way was by keeping up the quality of the seed stock. It was also of great advantage to use only certified seed in planting a crop no matter whether or not the farmer wished to produce seed or table stock, the main points in so doing being first that higher yields per acre would be produced, and second a better quality of potatoes. The average yield in Canada is less than five tons per acre, but by using certified seed this would be increased to from seven to eight tons. One of the audience asked why bother with potatoes if it does not pay when raising five tons per acre, and Mr. Macleod pointed out that with potatoes at \$15.00 a ton, the yield would only be worth \$75.00 while with eight tons it would be \$125.00 an acre. Further, if certified seed is used the grower gets a better quality and a better price for his product.

The speaker gave a concrete instance of this when he mentioned a Water Street dealer received an order for seventy tons for Alaska, and procured them from Ashcroft. When this shipment reached Vancouver the potatoes were full of disease and were not fit to ship. This was on account of not using certified seed, and the dealer then secured seventy tons from Lulu Island which stood shipment and had been well cared for and were perfectly satisfactory.

Mr. Macleod also pointed out that three of the diseases which are very common unless certified seed is used. They were Giant Hill, Fusarium-Wilt, and Blackleg, the two latter show inside, and the former causes the potato to be deep-eyed, rough and knobby. Those from Lulu Island being from certified seed proved conclusively that it pays well to do so.

The speaker was tendered a hearty vote of thanks for his interesting and instructive address.
