THE CHRISTMAS TURKEY

In view of the fact that the summer and early fall months is the time when plans for the raising and fattening of turkeys for the Christmas market have to be made, the issue of the new series bulletin on The Care and Management of Turkeys, published by the Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa,

comes at an opportune moment. Turkey breeding has developed to a considerable extent in Canada during the past few years, and success has been attained where adequate care has been bestowed on the birds. As in other industries, attention to detail is necessary to success. The selection of healthy, well-developed breeders, the management of the breeding stock, the proper feeding and housing of the turkeys, the provision of free range for growing birds, and requisite sanitation are recognized essentials. In order to keep the turkey flock free from disease, the greatest care should be exercised in the feeding

of the adult birds which should never be fed from the bare ground, but from scrupulously clean dishes or troughs, and too much caution cannot be observed in never allowing chickens to feed with the turkey flock during the seasons of the year when the chickens are frequenting the yard. With regard to housing, of which full details are given in the bulletin, breeding turkeys should not be confined to houses during the winter months but allowed to roam at will during the day. Little shelter is required for them. In any case turkeys should never be kept in a draughty place and never be housed with chickens.

OTTAWA—The busiest man in Canada today took time off this week to talk a few minutes to the Canadian Teachers' Federation.

That man is Prime Minister R. B. Bennett, political appointments, cabinet routine, election details, and the thousand and one other things that await a Prime Minister preparing for a general election campaign waited while Mr. Bennett reminded teachers of their responsibility to the young citizens of tomorrow.

His big morsel of advice was that school children should be encouraged to take more interest in both national and international affairs. Education is the shortest road to world peace he told the teachers' meeting here. He also reminded the educators that the laws of the land are made by the citizens, and that the mind of a nation is the place to plant the germ if they require alteration or reform. Lawlessness never serves any useful purpose.

Tuesday evening a big circus came to Ottawa. All the kiddies in the Capital were on pins and needles, as were a lot of grown ups, too. Not on pins and needles, but having a good time just the same Tuesday night "under the big tops" were none other than the Prime Minister and his retiring Minister of Finance Edgar N. Rhodes. For the few minutes back to childhood days, circus visitors Bennett and Rhodes admired the performing artists, fed the elephants and generally just had a real good time. They went back to their official duties "with a smile you could see a mile."

In the capital this week there are many grain men, including the nation's No. 1 grain man, John I. McFarland. Behind closed doors things were happening, but the public must wait for final word on what happened. As this letter went to press there was nothing official from Parliament Hill. As for the fixed price, the situation is changing so fast during the last week or ten days, all previous guesses on the figure are likely to prove worthless. Rust is sweeping the fields in the West that a week ago promised 40 bushels per acre, while Argentine is wrinkling her brow and praying hard for rain.

Acree in Argentine is down too. Drought is as bad in some sections of Southern Saskatchewan and Alberta as ever before. The rust situation is calamitous a large but unestimated territory.
