**MARGUERITE AND DISTRICT**

Threshing is nearly finished in this district. Walter Hogg's outfit came as far as the Young ranch, and the machine owned by Louis Westergard and W. B. Smith did threshing on the West side of the river before going to the Macalister district. Some excellent crops were reported. A four and a half acre field of wheat on Peter Eberling's farm at Castle Rock yielded about forty-five bushels to the acre. The oats on the same farm went better than sixty-five bushels to the acre. A road camp has been established near the Castle Rock ferry, with Fred Trueman in charge. They are doing some much-needed gravelling. Between the ferry and Rocky Point the road has been giving a great deal of trouble in wet weather, and

the work now being done on it will be a great improvement. The camp moved to the West side Monday.

Nohr Haur left by truck this week for a trip to Pent. con. He was accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. Edward Swanson and Gus Swanson.

Mrs. H. B. Hill has returned from Quesnel, where she recently underwent an operation for appendicitis.

A number of bar miners stopped operations on the river to go threshing. The general opinion was that mining was the better job, but they were glad to get away from their own cooking for a while.

The campaign to prevent the entry of the Japanese beetle into Canada from the infested areas of the United States has been under way since the last week in June in the districts of Halifax, St. John, Montreal, Toronto, Niagara Falls, and Windsor. In all 750 traps have been set up in these districts and a strict watch is being kept by the officers of the Entomological Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture, on consignments of merchandise and on motor cars from the infested districts over the border.

Two insect pests have been dealt with by the staff of the Dominion Entomological Laboratory at Chatham, Ontario. Sod webworms were extremely abundant throughout southwest Ontario, injuring lawns and golf courses and feeding rather extensively on field crops. At the same time the spotted cutworm was in outbreak form, particularly affecting white clover and sugar beets.

**Five Way Cookies**

1 1-3 cups (1 can) sweetened condensed milk.  
1/2 cup peanut butter.  
Any one of the five ingredients listed below.

- (1) 2 cups raisins.
  - (2) cups corn flakes.
  - (3) 3 cups coconut.
  - (4) 2 cups bran flakes.
  - (5) 1 cup nut meats chopped
- Thoroughly blend sweetened condensed milk, peanut butter and any one of the five ingredients listed above. Drop by spoonfuls on buttered baking sheet. Bake in moderately hot oven 15 minutes or until brown. Remove from pan at once. Makes about 2 1/2 dozen.

**Maple Cookies**

1 1-3 cups (1 can) sweetened condensed milk.  
2-3 cups maple syrup.  
2 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs.  
1/2 cup nut meats, chopped.  
Thoroughly blend sweetened condensed milk and maple syrup in heavy saucepan. Cook over low heat about five minutes or until mixture thickens, stirring constantly. Cool. Add graham cracker crumbs and chopped nut meats. Mix well. Drop by spoonfuls on buttered baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven 15 minutes or until brown. Remove from pan at once. Makes 2 dozen.

**Molasses Cookies**

1 1-3 cups (1 can) sweetened condensed milk.  
1/2 cup molasses.  
1/2 cup chopped raisins.  
1/2 cup chopped walnuts.  
2 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs.  
1/4 teaspoon ginger.  
1/2 teaspoon allspice.  
1/2 teaspoon salt.  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon.  
Thoroughly blend sweetened condensed milk and molasses. Add graham cracker crumbs, raisins, walnuts, spices and salt to mixture, lending thoroughly. Drop by spoonfuls on buttered baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven 10 minutes or until brown. Remove from pan at once. Makes four dozen.

**Peanut Macaroons**

1 pound roasted peanuts or 2 1/4 cups whole peanuts, shelled.  
1/4 teaspoon salt.  
1 1-3 cups (1 can) sweetened condensed milk.  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 egg white  
Shell peanuts, leaving on dark inner coverings. Put through food chopper. Thoroughly blend with salt sweetened condensed milk and vanilla. Fold in stiffly-beaten egg white. Drop by spoonfuls on buttered pan. (Several inches apart, as these spread in baking). Bake in moderate oven 15 minutes or until brown. Remove from pan at once. Makes 3 dozen.

**Creamed Turnips**

Pare and dice one large yellow or 6 or 8 small white turnips. Cook until tender in salted water. Melt 4 tablespoons butter, add 4 tablespoons flour and salt and pepper to taste and blend well. Add 2 cups milk and stir constantly until smooth and creamy. Add drained, cooked turnips, re-heat and serve.

**Making Batter**

When stirring a cake or batter on an enamel table, try placing a damp towel under the pan and it will prevent the pan from turning while beating.

**Headache**

A nervous headache can be frequently relieved if one will drink a cup of strong black coffee to which the juice of half a lemon has been added.

**Disagreeable Odor**

The cooking of cabbage or cauliflower will cause no disagreeable odor if it is put on the stove in cold water, to which has been added a good pinch of baking soda.

**Cleaning Mica**

To clean mica, wash thoroughly with vinegar, a little bit diluted. Then wipe it with a dry flannel cloth.

**Laundering Blankets**

When washing a woolen blanket, measure it before beginning the work, then drop it on a certain stretcher. It will dry quickly and will not shrink.
