This service functions under the Meat and Canned Foods Act and applies to interprovincial and export shipments of meat and food products manufactured in Canada, and to those products brought into the Dominion from other countries. shipped from one province to another, or to countries outside Canada; the handling of meat products must conform to stringent requirements; no harmful dyes, preservatives, or chemicals are allowed to be used, and honest labelling of the products is enforced.

To ensure all these points, the service of control is efficiently complete. The entire premises of establishments engaged in export of meats and meat products, including yards, pens and stables are placed under constant supervision of officers of the branch, and in the first place only those establishments with plants that meet the requirements of sanitation in regard to construction, equipment, and maintenance are allowed to operate. The actual work of inspection begins with the examination of the animals before and after slaughter. If there is no disease, the carcass is permitted to pass to the slaughtering department and from thence every phase of manufacture is under complete control. Nothing is allowed to enter or leave the plant without the knowledge, consent, and supervision of an inspector. Hence the legend "Canada Approved" is known all the world over as a real guarantee of pure and wholesome food.

MANY SUMMONS ISSUED BY B.C. COAST BOARD

There are more than 60,000 registered potato growers under the Potato Marketing Scheme of Great Britain which embraces England, Scotland and Northern Ireland. They cultivate well over 500,000 acres and produce for human consumption more than 2,000,000 tons a year according to the 1935 report of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries of Great Britain. During the year 1934 there were only 6 infractions of the scheme and the total fines amounted to 845 pounds or approximately \$300.00.

Under the B.C. Coast Vegetable Marketing Scheme there have been more than 107 summons issued for infractions since the commencement of operations at the beginning of the 1935 season. A few of these cases were withdrawn; 15 convictions have been obtained and there are 28 cases still to be heard with new apprehensions taking place each week.

CHANGES IN ANIMAL QUARANTINE REGULATIONS

Several new clauses appear in the amended regulations just issued relating to the quarantine and health of animals, operated by the Health of Animals Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture. Concerning the importation into Canada of cattle from the United States, clause (d) of section 39 states: "Cattle six months old or over, excluding steers and those for immediate slaughter, must be accompanied by a certificate signed and endorsed by a veterinarian of the United States Bureau of Animal Industry showing that the animals were subjected to a blood test for Bang's disease (infectious abortion) with negative results within sixty days of the date of exportation. When not so accompanied, such cattle may be detained in quarantine for such period as may be deemed necessary for the conduct of a test for Bang's disease. Reactors shall be permanently marked, slaughtered under inspection forthwith without compensation, or returned to the country of origin."

With reference to regulations of quarantine, section 54 states: "Quarantine stations shall be under the care and subject to the orders of the veterinary inspector in charge, who shall have the general superintendence and control of the employees and attendants and all other matters in connection therewith. Entry on to the quarantine premises by other persons is prohibited unless written authority has first been obtained from the Veterinary Director General."

On the same subject, section 58 directs that "Cattle unaccompanied by a satisfactory certificate of blood test for Bang's disease shall not be discharged from quarantine until they have been submitted to a blood test by an authorized official. Cattle reacting to the said blood test shall be permanently marked, slaughtered under inspection forthwith without compensation, or returned to country of origin."

Section 90, which prohibits anyone defacing, concealing or taking out wholly or in part any permanent mark applied under direction of the Veterinary Director General to cattle reacting to the tuberculin test, has been enlarged to include the test for Bang's disease. In like manner section 91 orders that "No person shall remove official identification ear tags affixed to an animal by an inspector except under the authority of the Veterinary Director General."

In regard to the feeding of swine, vegetable refuse has been included in section 92 which states: "The feeding of swine upon garbage or swill, meat scraps and offal, and vegetable refuse, either raw or cooked, obtained elsewhere than on the premises where fed, is prohibited, unless special permits on writing is first obtained from the Veterinary Director General."

Further information concerning the regulations may be obtained by writing to the Veterinary Director General, Health of Animals Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.

Although Canada has a relatively small non-agricultural population for the absorption of surplus pro-

duct on, approximately 85 per cent of the agricultural production in Canada is consumed in Canada, with the remaining 15 per cent finding markets abroad.

Creamery butter to the amount of 239,348,785 pounds was produced in Canada in 1935, showing an increase of 5,790,981 pounds, or 2.5 per cent, compared with 1934. Factory cheese produced in Canada during 1935 amounted to 100,398,282 pounds, an increase of 1.1 per cent, compared with 1934.

From January to March is the best time to plant carnation cuttings for the reason that at this period the plants are strong and vigorous. Later on the plants will be weakened by flower production. A great deal of information on the subject may be gleaned from the circular on carnation culture issued by the Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.

Quality in beef cannot exist without a reasonable amount of fat. However, it should not be assumed that, because beef must be fat in order to be good, all fat beef is good beef. Cows may carry a considerable amount of fat, but neither the fat nor the lean from an old animal possesses the desired quality. The fat on beef from an animal of this kind can usually be distinguished by its softness and high color. The best beef to buy is brandad beef.

GOOD DRIVERS "ARRESTED"

To be arrested by police, brought into court and "fined" has been the experience of many Minneapolis car drivers who have never violated a traffic law or hit a pedestrian. In fact, it is reported, watchful policemen have been spending a good part of their time "arresting" the better drivers of that city. And the drivers "take it and like it" for the "fine" imposed is a gift of a new set of 1935 plates, presented through the courtesy of the Minneapolis Star. This unique practice has been adopted to encourage good driving so that it may be an honor as well as a disgrace to be haled into court. A trade paper expresses the hope that the idea will be widely accepted and that the names of the best drivers in a town will appear in an "honor roll" in daily newspapers.

QUARTZ TO INCREASE CAPACITY OF MILL

It is reported that the milling capacity of the Cariboo Gold Quartz Mine will be considerably stepped up during the coming year. At present the equipment in operation will handle 150 tons per day. It is understood that "orders" have been placed for machinery to bring this up to 275 tons and it is hoped to have this in operation before the end of 1936.

The decision to make this increase was reached after careful consideration of the quality of the ore reserves that have recently been developed, and it was shown that there would be no difficulty in supplying the tonnage required.

This will have the effect of nearly doubling the output of the mine and no doubt one result will be that the present dividend of 2 1/2 per share per quarter will be raised to 5 cents.

BUYING FISH IS PROHIBITED

The Provincial Department of Fisheries and Game has issued a warning against buying fish in Cariboo. This warning is made especially with reference to buying from Indians. It includes game also.

The penalties for infractions of this Act range up to a maximum of \$1000.
