**THE HOUSEWIFE**  
**EGG CROQUETTES**  
 Two cups chopped eggs, hard-cooked, 1 cup thick white sauce, ½ teaspoon salt, 1-8 teaspoon pepper, dash of cayenne, egg and crumbs.  
 Eggs should be chopped fine, moistened with sauce as soft as can be handled, and seasoned. Let chill thoroughly on flat dish, well buttered, then divide evenly into portions, allowing two tablespoons for each croquette. Shape into balls, cylinders, cones or any desired shape. Roll in crumbs, dip in egg, again in crumbs and fry in deep fat till light brown in color. Drain on soft paper. Serve with a sauce.  
**SOUTHERN POT ROAST**  
 One small pork shoulder, 1 medium onion sliced, 2 cups canned tomatoes, salt and pepper, 2 tablespoons flour.  
 Fry out the trimmings in pan suitable for the roast. Remove cracklings and all fat, leaving but one tablespoon. Add flour. Brown slowly. Add onion. Brown slightly, then add tomatoes. Season the meat and add. Cook in fireless cooker four hours.  
**FRESH GREEN PEAS WITH EGGS**  
 Cook until tender enough new green peas to make 2 cups. Beat with a beater 6 eggs until light; season with salt, pepper, 1 teaspoon minced parsley and 6 green onions chopped fine. Then add the peas well seasoned. Cook in a well-greased pan, then place a generous helping on the rounds of buttered toast, and serve at once for luncheon.  
**LEMON CHEESE**  
 Juice of 4 lemons, 2 pounds of loaf sugar, ½ pound of butter, 6 eggs. Put all the ingredients into a jar, then put into a kettle in cold water and let boil until it is stiff (jam thickness). I would like to emphasize the using of loaf sugar. This has something to do with the preservation of the mixture, as it will keep for months. It is delicious for tarts, but too rich for pies.  
**SCOTCH SCONES**



## Provincially Speaking

### OKANAGAN CONTROL BODY BEGINS OPERATIONS

(Vernon News)

Controlled fruit marketing in the Okanagan Valley began again this week after the abrogation of the Tree Fruit Board by the Supreme Court of Canada last June. The new control body, B.C. Tree Fruits Limited, has received the signature pladge of 1489 growers authorizing the shippers to make levy deductions and in this way provide the funds required for operating expenses. This total represents 85.5 per cent of the list of registered growers but the drive to secure unanimous approval of the scheme will be maintained. Carload shipments of McIntosh Reds will be made within the next week.—(PNS).

### FILM STAR GETS ROUSING SEND-OFF ON DEPARTURE

(Revelstoke Review)

Richard Arlen, film celebrity and star of the "Great Divide," an epic picture of construction days on the Canadian Pacific Railway, departed from the set last week for Hollywood. "Dick" was the recipient of many gifts and at the time of his leaving the town turned out en masse to throng the station. Three rousing cheers given as the train started motion indicated the esteem in which Arlen was held by the people of Revelstoke.—(PNS).

### JAPANESE INVESTIGATE SALMON FISHERIES OF NORTH PACIFIC

During the summer months of this year several prominent Japanese officials of technical institutes and commercial companies have been making an extensive survey and study of the salmon and other fisheries off the coast of British Columbia.

This activity coincides with the wishes of Professor Seiji Kondo at the Institute of Pacific Relations held at Yosemite, California, expressed last month. He requested that a programme of scientific investigation into salmon fisheries of the North Pacific be made to determine the rights and interests of Japan and United States in the fishery.

At numerous points along the Alaska and British Columbia coast the Japanese have been conducting their own scientific research. Tests of salinity, temperatures and currents of the coastal and offshore waters have been made.

TANGIER, Morocco—France demands an apology from the Spanish rebels for the execution of a French citizen in Rabat, Spanish Morocco. Unless the apology is forthcoming France threatens to close all ports in French Morocco to the Spaniards.

## CANADA'S NATIONAL PARKS

The growth of Canada's system of National Parks has been one of the most interesting developments of the past half century, and their inception almost coincided with the first transcontinental railway in 1885. The initial reservation of ten square miles was made in the same year. That area embraced the mineral hot springs at Banff, Alberta, and from this modest start grew Banff National Park.

Since that time the Federal Government has set aside in Alberta and British Columbia a nearly 9,000 square miles in National Parks. This equal to about two-thirds of the size of Switzerland or nearly as large as Belgium.

To this exclusive territory must be added those National Parks established in Saskatchewan and Manitoba which have a combined area of over 3,000 square miles. Smaller National Parks have been created in Ontario, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, the last two being known as Historic Sites.

The functions of National Parks are to conserve fauna, flora and landscape, to preserve and mark Historic Sites and to provide areas

where people may withdraw for periods of rest and recreation wholly undisturbed by the distractions of city and town life.

Accommodation ranges from the modest campsite to the palatial hotel, depending upon the inclination of the visitor. Golf, tennis and fishing are among the many forms of recreation which may be had.

As time goes on the popularity of our National Parks continues to increase. During the past five years no fewer than three million persons have been registered. This represents an increase of more than seven hundred thousands over the preceding five-year period.

LOEN, Norway — A huge avalanche of rock which crashed into Loen Lake took 70 lives here. The

slide caused a huge wall of water to submerge two small towns. Only about 20 persons survived, and many of them are not expected to live, so seriously were they injured.

PORTLAND, Me.—The Republican Party captured all seats in the State of Maine, electing a Governor, a Senator and three Representatives.

VICTORIA—Provincial authorities have requested the Federal authorities for aid in placing the men who drift to Vancouver's mild climate for the winter in jobs, so that they will not be a burden on the city. It is estimated that there will be between 12,000 and 15,000 single unemployed who will need assistance.
