## Potatoes in the Menu

The potato is pre-eminent among the vegetables used for food. Not only does the potato furnish considerable nutriment but supplies it in an easily digestible form, because the starch in potatoes is more readily digested than the starch of some other starch-producing foods. The mineral contained in potatoes is relatively larger in proportion to other foods. The potato contains vitamins A, B, C, and G and modern science has shown that it is less fattening than many of the ordinarily used foods. However, the potato is somewhat deficient in protein and fats and should not be used exclusively in the diet but should be combined with lean meat, eggs, or other protein or fat-supplying food.

The best way to cook a potato is to bake, boil, or steam it in its jacket because much of the protein and mineral matter lies directly under the skin. A potato quickly boiled is a potato quickly spoiled. The following are recipes with potatoes as an ingredient:

### Ginger Fingers

Sift together 2 cups flour, 2 dessertspoons of powdered ginger, 1/4 teaspoon of salt and 1/4 cup fruit sugar. Cut in 2-3 cup shortening, then add 2 dessertspoons finely chopped preserved ginger. Mix to a soft dough with cold water. Roll thin, cut in finger lengths, and sprinkle with granulated sugar and shedded preserved ginger. Bake in a hot oven.

### Potato Fish Pie

3 cups hot mashed potatoes  
3 cups left-over baked, boiled or steamed fish  
1/2 pint white coating sauce, well seasoned  
2 tablespoons melted butter  
1 teaspoon chopped parsley  
Flake the fish into sauce. Add

parsley. Pour the fish with the sauce into buttered fireproof dish. Cover with a fork. Sprinkle with melted butter. Bake in moderate oven until brown on top and well heated through. Enough for 6 persons. When salmon pie is wanted, substitute 1 lb. can for the fish. Remove the skin and bones. Add 1 tablespoon chopped capers to the white sauce, or 2 hard boiled chopped eggs.

### Cream of Potato Soup

1 to 2 cups chopped, cooked, boiled or steamed potatoes  
2 cups potato water  
3 cups milk  
1 1/4 oz. butter  
1 1/2 oz. flour  
1 small onion chopped finely  
1 teaspoon chopped parsley  
Salt and pepper to taste  
Place potatoes in a saucepan. Add potato water and chopped onion and parsley. Cover and simmer for 20 minutes. Melt butter in another pan, stir in flour, off the heat, and when flour is smooth, stir in hot milk by degrees. Return to heat and stir till boiling. Add the potato broth which may be whisked or sieved. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Add parsley. Enough for 4 to 6 persons.

### Sliced Ham Baked with Pineapple

1 slice ham 1 inch thick  
1 teaspoon prepared mustard  
4 slices pineapple  
Sugar  
1/2 cup pineapple juice  
Spread ham with mustard and place slices of pineapple on top, sprinkling with sugar. Place in shallow pan and add pineapple juice. Bake, covered, for 1 1/2 hours in a moderate oven, uncovering the last 20 minutes to brown.

### Cocoa Cake

2 eggs  
1/2 cup butter  
2 cups brown sugar  
2 cups flour  
1/4 cup cocoa  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
1 cup sour milk or cream  
1 teaspoon soda dissolved in milk  
Cream butter and sugar, add eggs

well beaten, add cocoa and other ingredients. Bake in layers and ice with cocoa icing.

### Oatmeal Macaroons

2 teaspoons butter  
1 cup sugar  
2 eggs  
2 1/2 cups rolled oats  
2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream the butter and add one-half the sugar. Beat the yolks of the eggs, add the rest of the sugar and combine with the first mixture. Add the flavoring and fold in the whites of the eggs stiffly beaten. Add the rolled oats mixed with the baking powder and salt. Drop from a teaspoon two inches apart, on a baking sheet and bake until brown.

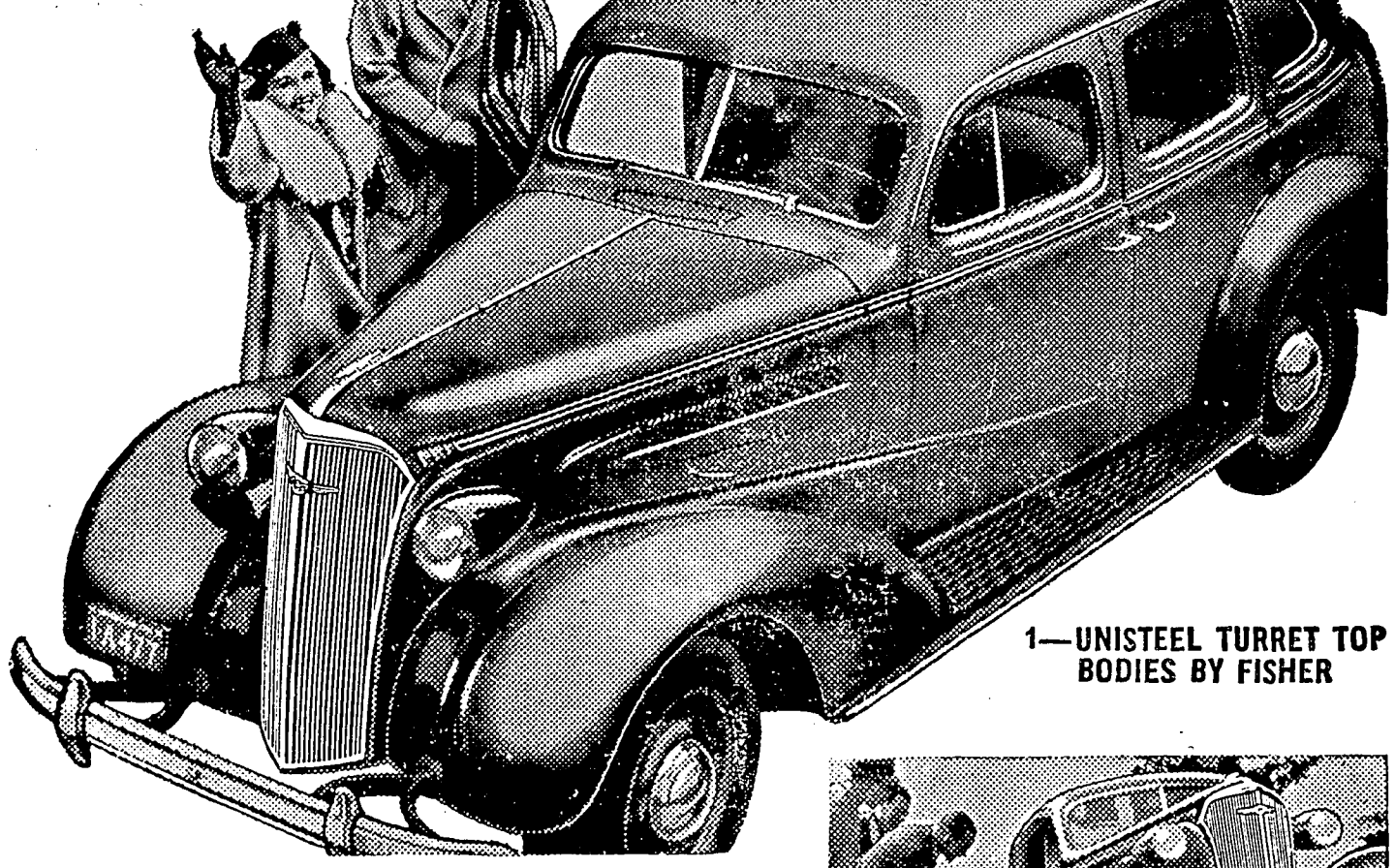

## GOLD QUARTZ PRODUCTION UP FOR FEBRUARY

An announcement by J. R. V. Dunlop, secretary of the Cariboo Gold Quartz Mining Company Ltd. recently, was to the effect that the production of the mine for the month of February was \$12,614 higher than for the regular recovery for January. The recovery was \$81,970 from the milling of 5,871 tons of ore. There was less ore milled in February, 6,312 tons being milled in January.  
During the month of January the regular clean-up of \$69,356 was augmented by the sum of \$40,635, which resulted from the clean up of the ball mill, which takes place at regular intervals. Values during February were considerably in excess in value per ton of the month of January.

CARIBOO'S VOTERS INCREASED BY THOUSAND  
 According to figures not yet complete, the number of voters in the Cariboo (Provincial) Riding have in-

creased by nearly one-third over the last official registration.

Some of the larger increases are as follows: Barkerville increased by 76 voters; Quesnel by 247 voters; Williams Lake by 65 voters; and Wells by 341 voters. The number of Wells voters at the last Provincial election was only 18, it is now 359.

Two new polls are listed, Wingdam with a total of 115 voters and Moose Heights with 45 voters.

In the last election there were 2,235 registered voters in the Cariboo Provincial Riding; now there are 3,299 to date, with a few more to be added. Quesnel's vote is the largest in the district by nearly 300 votes.

OLD-TIME LINEMAN PASSES

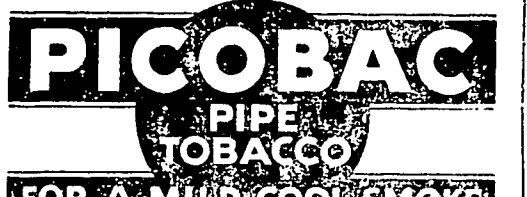

He was stipendiary magistrate for the Vanderhoof district and retained that office until his death.

He was a member of the Masonic Order. He is survived by two brothers, Alex at Salmon Arm and Frank in Vancouver, and two sisters, both of whom reside in Ottawa. The funeral arrangements, which are in the hands of the Nechako Lodge, will take place in Vanderhoof Tuesday afternoon.
