Three cups cooked rice, butter, 1 1/2

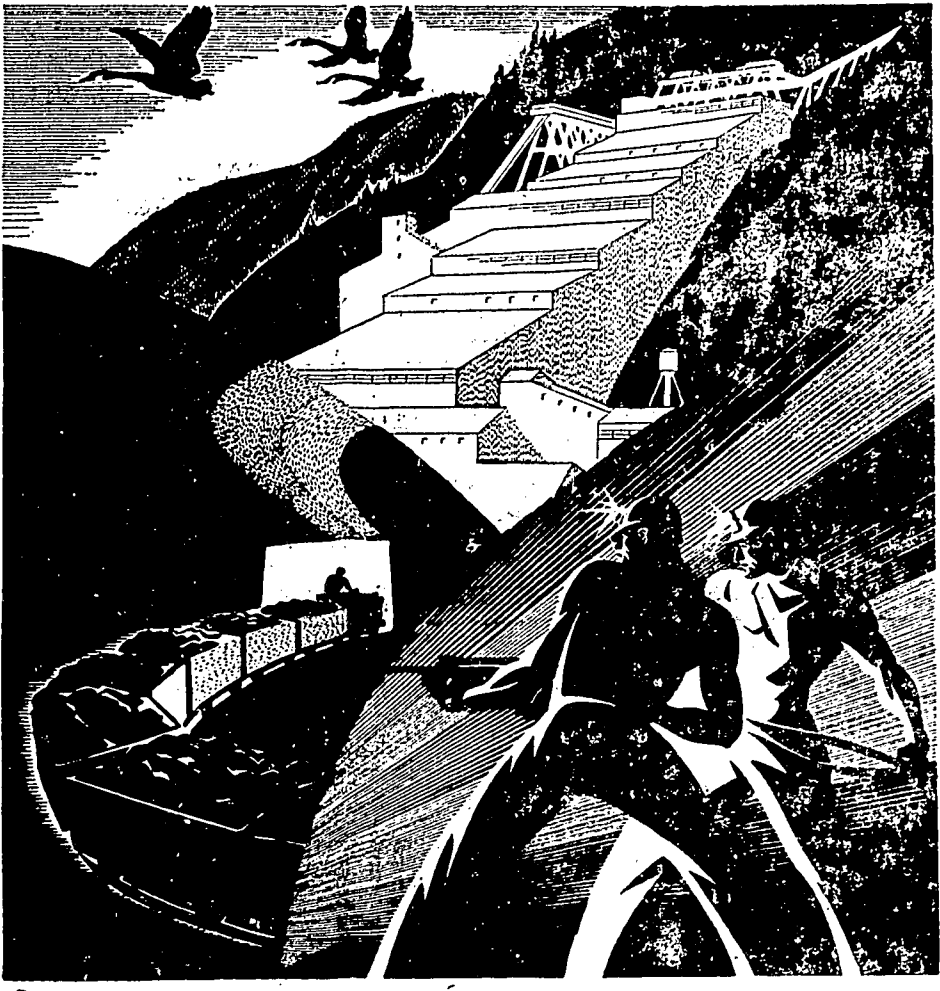

**CELERY WITH BROWN SAUCE**

One quart chopped celery, 1 tablespoon each of butter and flour, 1 tablespoon catsup, 1 cup strong stock, few grains cayenne pepper. Cut crisp celery into 2-inch pieces and cook in boiling, salted water for 20 minutes. Melt butter in saucepan, add flour, and cook and stir until brown. Add gradually the stock, and cook until thickened, stirring constantly. Add 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/8 teaspoon pepper, cayenne, and catsup. Drain celery, add to the sauce, and cook until celery is very tender, then serve.

**NUT AND DATE CAKE**

One cup sugar, one-half cup butter, one-cup milk, 1 1/2 cups pastry flour, two eggs, one cup of dates washed and cut into pieces, one cup chopped nuts, one heaping teaspoon of baking powder. Beat the butter with the sugar, add eggs and then use a Dover beater; then add the milk and flour, having previously sifted the baking powder with the flour. Mix quickly and add raisins and nuts. Bake on a sheet in a moderate oven for thirty-five minutes.

**CORN CHOWDER**

One can corn, two cupfuls peeled, diced potatoes, two cupfuls peeled, diced onions, two tablespoons bacon fat or butter, two tablespoons salt, one-fourth teaspoonful pepper, one-fourth cupful each of flour and butter, three cupfuls each of boiling water and hot milk, one-fourth teaspoon paprika. Place bacon fat and onion in kettle, and let cook until onion is golden brown, then add potatoes, corn and boiling water, and cook until potatoes are tender. Then add seasonings, hot milk, and the butter, blended with the flour. Cook a few minutes, and serve very hot.

**CORNMEAL GRIDDLE CAKES**

One cup sweet milk, 1/2 cup cornmeal, 2-3 cup flour, 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon sugar, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons shortening.

Method: Scald milk and pour it over cornmeal. (If cakes are to be used for breakfast, do this the preceding night; if for supper, do it in the morning). Mix well together and cover. In the morning sift the remaining dry ingredients, and add to the mixture with well-beaten egg and shortening. Beat well and fry in hot pan.

**HEADCHEESE**

One pig's head, 3 or 4 pounds beef, salt, pepper, 1 onion.

Method: Wash and scrape head, removing all hairs, and boil until all the bones drop out. Remove from pot and cut with a knife into small pieces. (Do not put through meat chopper, as this makes it too fine). Take out all the bones and thick skin. (Some of the skin, if it is not too thick, may be used). Have the beef boiled soft also, then put all back into kettle, add the pepper and salt, onion and a little summer savory, and boil until the onion is soft.

**SCRAMBLED FISH**

Have ready four ounces cooked white fish, free from skin and bone, and well flaked. Melt 1 1/2 ounces of butter, add the fish and heat thoroughly. Beat up 2 eggs with a tablespoon of milk, season well, and pour on to the fish. Cook slowly, stirring all the time until the eggs begin to thicken, then pile quickly on hot buttered toast.

assure him success in any role, from circus management to law-giver. It is not on record that he ever took his politics seriously, certainly not to the point of insisting that one party was always right and the other always wrong. As a matter of fact there were many who regarded Louis as a political maverick, each side hoping that when the time for round-up came Louis would be found numbered with it. Most of the party men, however, are willing to concede that he possesses the graces of both political schools of thought, and that he could not go very far wrong if he were called upon to represent Cariboo either as a Liberal or Conservative.—Prince George Citizen.

"With the news of the coming Liberal Convention at Williams Lake on May 1st, there is the usual talk and rumor of who will represent the Cariboo in the next House.

"Judging from rumor and gossip that is going around, there may possibly be three candidates for nomination from the north end of the district, and none from the South Cariboo.

Apparently Mr. J. M. Yorston has definitely refused to stand for nomination. At present L. LeBourdais' name is receiving the most favorable comment as the logical candidate for nomination at the coming Convention."—Williams Lake Tribune.

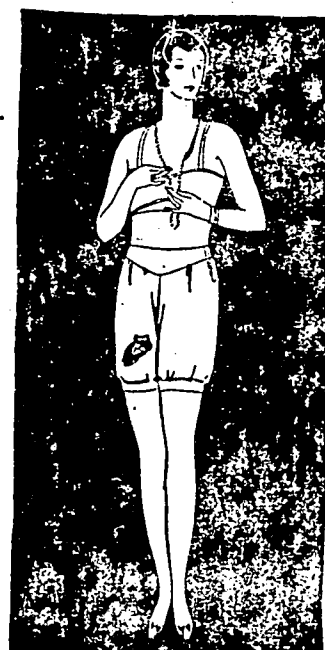
