RHUBARB IN THE MENU
Canadian forced rhubarb is now

available on the market and may be used in various ways in the household. Apart from rhubarb stewed or baked, rhubarb gives the distinctive touch to tapioca puddings, tarts, sherbets, gelatine, and shortcakes. The juice makes a delicious cooling drink. Also the juice combined with

sugar and the stiffly beaten white of an egg makes an enticing creamy sauce, and some people declare that one of the finest combinations ever tasted is rhubarb and strawberries cooked together.

Rhubarb Sauce

The easiest way to prepare rhubarb is in sauce. One method consists of first making a thick syrup of sugar, cutting the rhubarb into pieces about half an inch long and dropping the pieces into the syrup and cooking until tender. This takes only a few minutes. Another method is the mixing of two parts of the fruit to one part of sugar and cooking them until the liquid oozes out and forms a syrup.

Apple and Rhubarb Jelly

Cut apples into quarters. To every pound of apples add one cup of rhubarb juice. Simmer until the apples are soft. Strain through a jelly bag without pressure. To each pint of juice add one pound of sugar. Boil slowly removing all scum until the juice will jell. Pour into tumblers and seal with paraffin.

Baked Rhubarb

Baked rhubarb may be made when the oven is cooking some other food. Butter a covered baking dish, spread a layer of rhubarb over the bottom,

sprinkle a layer of sugar, then add another layer of rhubarb, and so on until the dish is filled. Sprinkle sugar over the top and then add small pieces of butter and the grated rind of a lemon. Cover the dish and bake slowly until the fruit is tender. Long, slow baking gives rhubarb a rich red color.

BUTTER MAKES A DIFFERENCE

What is it that makes one cake or batch of cookies taste so much better than another? True, every ingredient affects the finished product but it is the shortening that makes the marked difference in palatability. Strong-flavored shortening gives a pronounced, usually objectionable, taste to cakes and cookies, while on the other hand flavor is lacking in baked goods made with a tasteless or very mild type of shortening. Without taking into consideration its nutritional superiority due to vitamin content, the distinctive, inimitable flavor of butter justifies its general use for highest quality baking.

In recommending the following recipes for "butter" cakes and cookies attention is drawn to the fact that butter is very easily and quickly creamed if left in room temperature for a short time before using.

Butterscotch Cookies

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup sifted brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 1/2 cups pastry flour
- 3/4 teaspoon soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Cream the butter, add sugar and the well beaten egg. Add the vanilla and the sifted dry ingredients and nuts. Form into rolls. Wrap in waxed paper and chill in the refrigerator. When required, slice in thin slices and bake in a moderate oven 8 to 10 minutes.

Dream Bars

- 1/2 cup butter
 - 1 1/2 cups flour
 - 1/2 cup brown sugar
- Mix together to a crumbly mass like pie crust. Pat into butter pan (9 inches by 9 inches). Bake in moderate oven until slightly browned.

- Mix together:
- 1 cup brown sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - 2 tablespoons flour
 - 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1 or 1 1/2 cups coconut
 - 1/2 or 1 1/2 cups meats chopped
- Pour this over baked mixture, bake again until browned (20 to 25 minutes). When cool cut in bars.

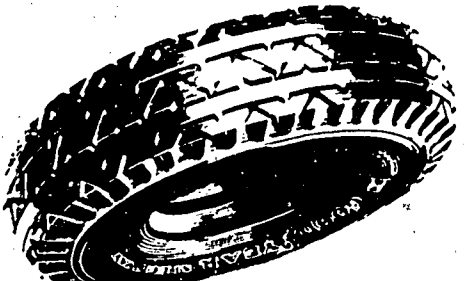
The girls game was a veritable walk-over for the Lake lassies, the final score being 30-12 in their favor. These girls are altogether too good for ours at present.

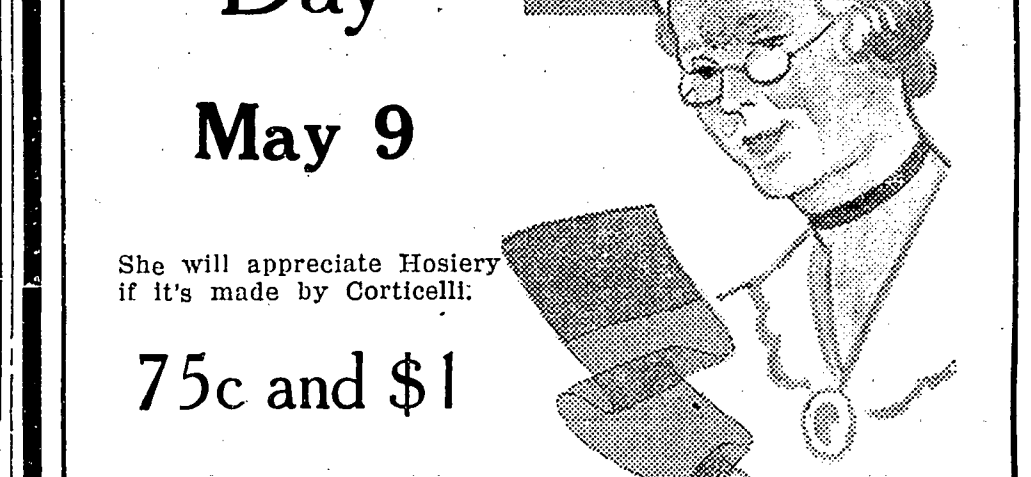
