BUTTER CAKES AND COOKIES
 In giving recipes for butter cakes and cookies, the Milk Utilization Service, Dairy Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture, draws attention to the fact that butter is very easily creamed if left in room temperature a short time before being used.

Butter Cake
 1/2 cup butter
 1-3 cup fine granulated sugar
 2 eggs
 1 teaspoon flavoring
 1-4 teaspoon salt
 2 1-2 teaspoons baking powder
 1 3-4 cups flour
 1-2 cup milk
 Cream butter. Add sugar gradually and cream together. Add well beaten eggs and flavoring. Beat well. Add alternately the milk and dry ingredients, add baking powder with last amount of flour. Bake in a moderate oven in buttered loaf pan.

Butter Icing
 4 tablespoons butter
 1 1-2 cups icing sugar
 Milk, cream or fruit juice
 Flavoring
 Cream butter. Add sugar gradually. Beat well. Add liquid drop by drop until of desired consistency.

Oatmeal Cookies
 1 cup butter
 1 1-2 cups brown sugar
 1 egg
 1 1-4 cups fine rolled oats
 1 1-2 cups flour
 1 1-2 teaspoon soda
 1 teaspoon baking powder
 Pinch of salt
 1 cup cocoanut
 Cream butter. Add sugar and the cream well together. Add well beaten egg and then dry ingredients and cocoanut. Drop by spoonfuls on buttered baking sheet and bake in moderate oven until brown, about 8 to 10 minutes.

Butterscotch Cookies
 1-2 cup butter
 1 cup sifted brown sugar
 1 egg
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 1 1-2 cups pastry flour
 3-4 teaspoon soda
 1-4 teaspoon salt
 1-2 cup chopped walnuts
 Cream the butter, add sugar and the well beaten egg. Add vanilla and the sifted ry ingredients and nuts. Form into rolls. Wrap in waxed paper and chill. When required slice in thin slices and bake in a moderate oven 8 to 10 minutes.

Brownies
 1/2 cup butter
 2 eggs
 3-4 cup sugar
 2 squares (ounces) unsweetened chocolate
 1/2 cup flour
 1-2 teaspoon baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 1 teaspoon chopped walnuts
 Cream butter. Add sugar gradually and cream well together. Add well beaten eggs, chocolate melted over hot water, flour, baking powder, salt, vanilla and walnuts. Spread in well buttered pan one inch thick. Bake in a moderate oven 20 to 25 minutes. Cut in squares while warm.

The value of mineral production for the year 1936 was \$54,081,967; being an increase of \$5,260,728 over the value for 1935.

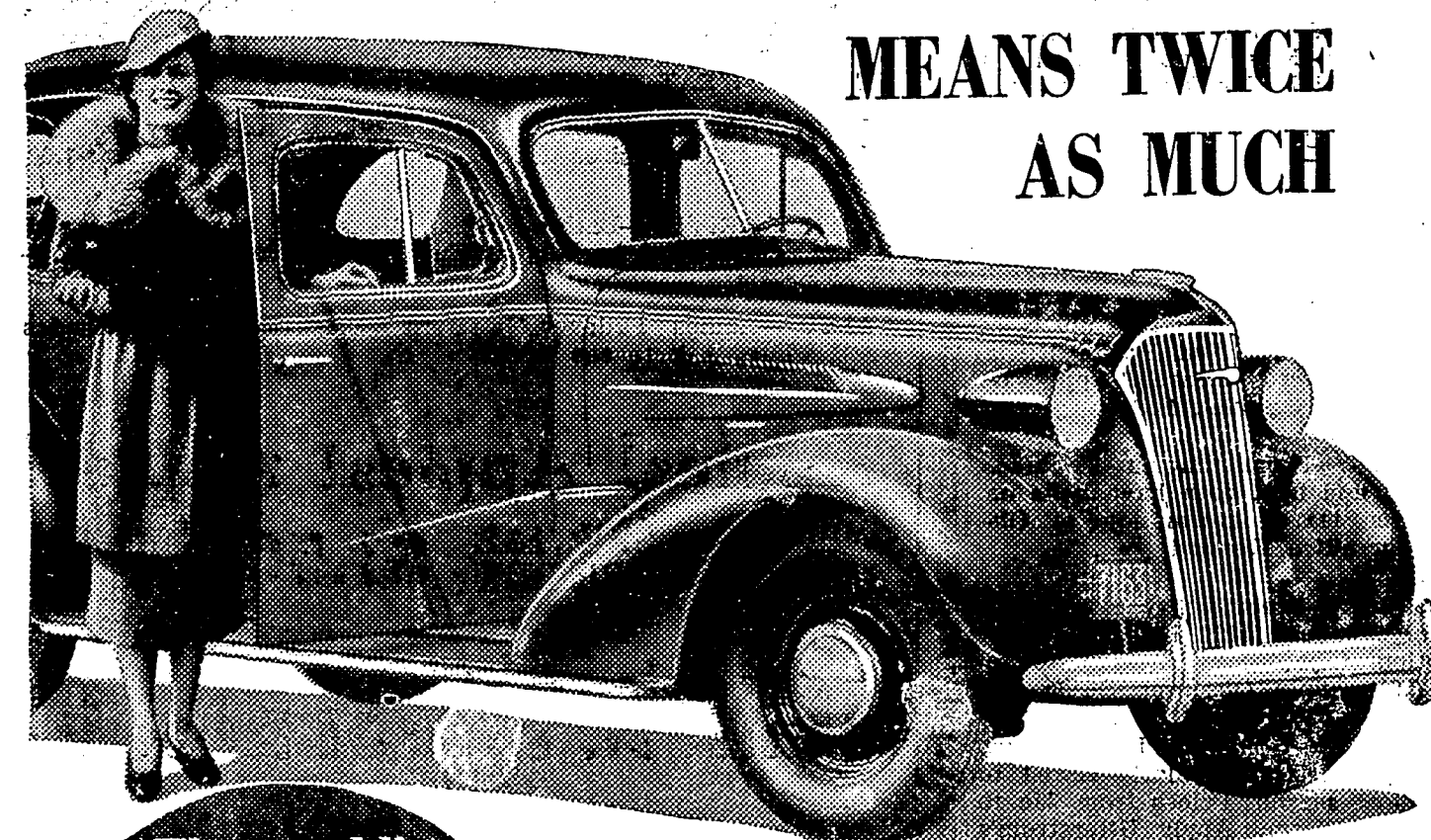

Weekly World News in Brief

LONDON, Eng.—The decree nisi granted to Mrs. Wallis Warfield Simpson last October was made absolute this week. The final court proceedings lasted twenty-five seconds. H.R.H. the Duke of Windsor was reunited to his fiancée at Monts, France, when he journeyed to the Chateau de Candé where Mrs. Simpson is the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bedeaux.

LONDON, Eng.—Up to the time of going to press no news had been received of the settlement of the bus strike which is crippling transport in England. The Rt. Hon. Stanley Baldwin made a final appeal to that small handful of men in whose hands lay the power to restore peace. In making this plea Mr. Baldwin stated that he was making the last appeal of his career. It was interpreted by a crowded House as a gesture of farewell from the great champion of democracy.

VICTORIA, B.C.—The Minister of Public Works has announced a \$1,000,000 road programme of B.C. in the coming year. All sections of the province will benefit, the work mainly consisting of reconstruction, widening and straightening of roads.
