THE HOUSEWIFE

ORANGE PUDDING

Juice and rind of 1 orange, 1 table-

spoon butter, 1 cup sugar, 2 cups water. Put the above ingredients into a baking pan and bring to the boiling point. Then add by spoonfuls the following batter: 1/2 tablespoon butter, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 cup flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 cup milk. Bake in a moderate oven—350 de-

grees—for twenty minutes. The crust should be brown. The juice under the crust makes delicious syrupy sauce for the pudding. It is best served warm with whipped cream.

FISH BAKED IN MILK

Place 1 1/2 lbs. of fish in buttered baking-dish. Chop up small onion. Add 4 ounces of fine oatmeal to it. Season with salt and pepper and a

sprinkling of parsley. Bind with 2 ounces of melted dripping. Mould into small balls. Arrange around the fish. Pour in 1/4 pint of milk, and bake in a moderate oven for half an hour.

CHEESE NIBS

(For Afternoon Tea) Cut day-old bread into 1/2-inch cubes, and scoop-out the centres. Dip each cube quickly in melted butter, and fill the cavities with a mixture consisting of 1 egg-yolk, well beaten; 1/16 teaspoon each paprika and cayenne pepper, and as much nippy, grated cheese as will make a moist consistency. Place on sheets, bake in a hot oven, and serve at once with gherkins.

RHUBARB AND BANANA PIE

Two cups diced rhubarb, 1 1/4 cups crushed banana, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 3/4 cup granulated sugar, 2 tablespoons pastry flour.

Combine fruits and lemon juice. Mix sugar and flour and combine with fruits. Pour into a pie plate lined with pastry. Moisten edge and place on scored top crust. Bake at 450 degrees F. for 15 minutes, reduce heat to 350 degrees F. and bake 25 minutes longer.

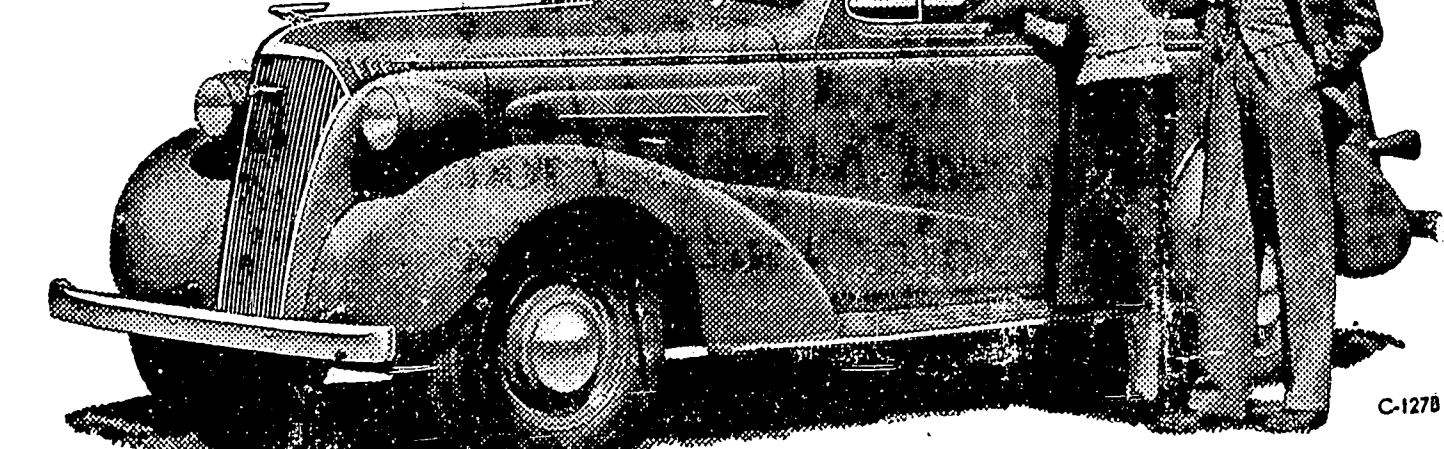

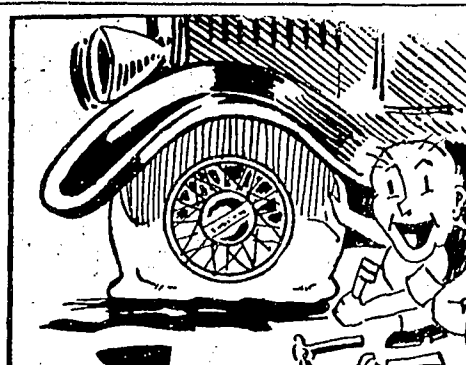
