STEAMED MAPLE NUT PUDDING

salt, 2 teaspoons baking powder, ¼ teaspoon baking soda, 2 tablespoons brown sugar, 1½ tablespoons butter, 1½ tablespoons lard, ½ cup chopped walnuts, ¾ cup maple syrup, 1 egg (well beaten).

Combine first seven ingredients as for tea biscuits, add nuts, then com-

bine syrup and egg. Fill individual moulds half full, cover with parchment paper, steam 35 minutes. Serve with maple syrup or lemon sauce. Make six moulds.

APRICOT MERINGUE PIE

Stew the fruit as usual and press it through a sieve, with its juice. Then add sugar to taste and cook

ten minutes. Fill pastry-lined pie tins with the fruit and bake. When cool spread with a meringue made by beating the whites of two eggs to a stiff froth with 4 tablespoons of granulated sugar; then beat again until the mixture will retain its shape; now fold in 2 more tablespoons of sugar and ¼ cup of apricot pulp. Brown delicately in a moderate oven.

POTATO CAKE

One cup mashed potatoes, 1¼ cup flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons shortening, ½ cup milk, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 egg.
Mix shortening with the potato; drop in the unbeaten egg; then the milk; sift flour with salt and baking powder; roll out. Cut and bake in hot oven.

GINGER BREAD

One-half cup shortening, ½ cup brown sugar, 1 cup molasses, 2 eggs, ¾ cup hot water, 3 cups sifted flour, sifted with 1 teaspoon each of salt, soda, cloves, and dessert spoon ginger. Into a bowl place the shortening, sugar, molasses and eggs, and beat well. Then stir in the hot water. Stir in the flour mixture gradually, beat well, and pour into a long shallow, greased pan. Bake in an oven of 350 degrees about twenty-five minutes, or a few moments longer. Serve hot with cream cheese balls.

DATE SURPRISES

Fill large pitted dates with smoothly candied honey. Add a whole almond or piece of walnut if desired. Coat with chocolate.

HONEY FRUIT BALLS

Grind together in food chopper a mixture of any dried fruit and nuts (raisins with peanuts are good). Add a little lemon juice and enough honey to bind the ingredients well. Form into balls and roll in chopped nuts or cocoanut.

STUFFED SALMON PEPPERS

4 tablespoons butter
4 tablespoons flour
1½ cups milk
½ cup sharp Canadian cheese, cut into small pieces
1 teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon pepper
Dash of onion or celery salt
2 cups (1-pound tin) canned salmon, flaked
2 cups whole kernel peppers.
Blend butter and flour and brown lightly in a saucepan. Add milk and stir until thick and smooth. Add cheese, cut in small pieces and stir until melted. Season with salt, pepper, onion or celery salt; then add flaked canned salmon and corn (drained). Cut tops from green peppers, remove seeds and parboil for 3 minutes. Drain and place in baking dish. Fill with salmon mixture and bake in moderate oven for 30-35 minutes. Serves six.

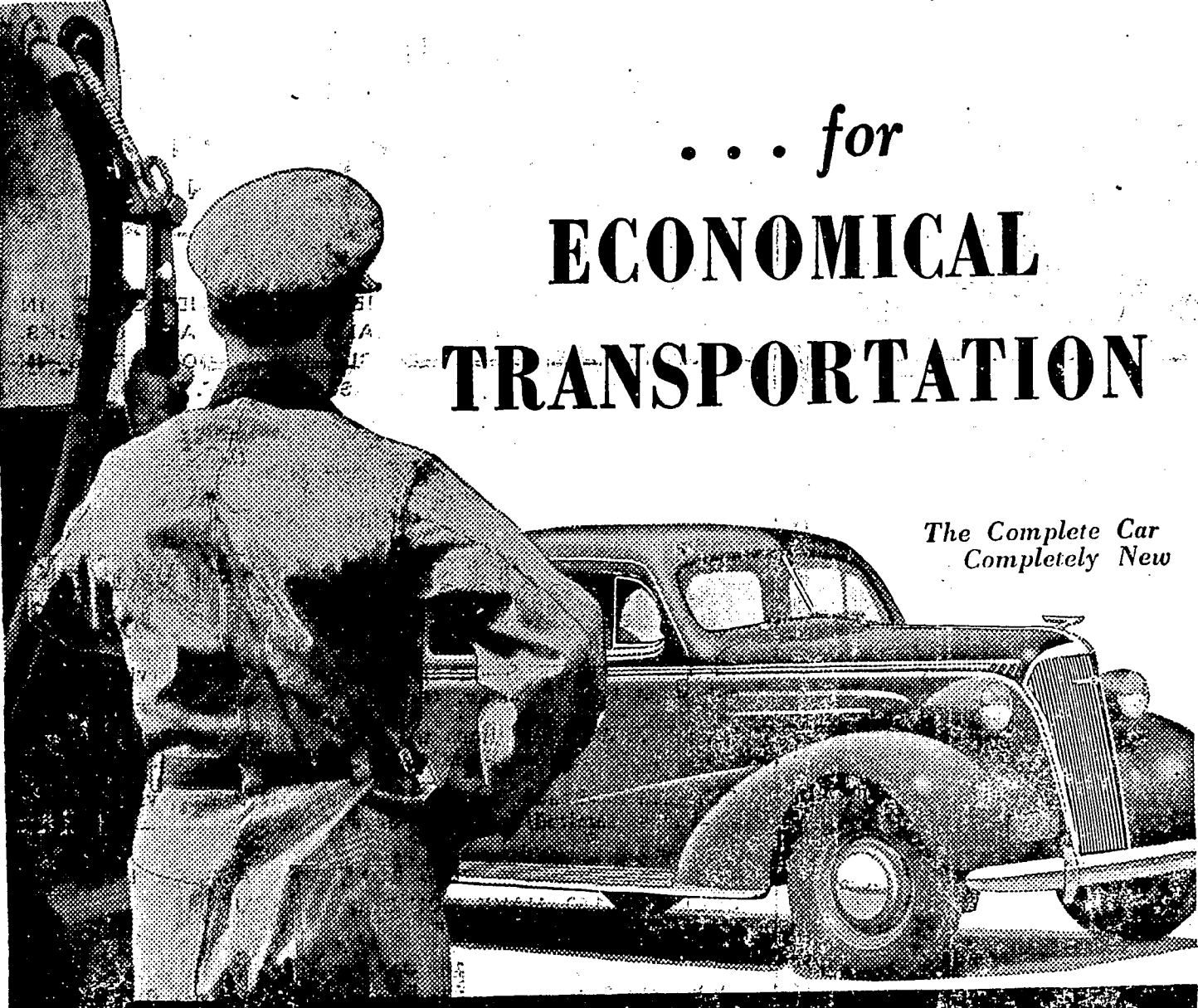

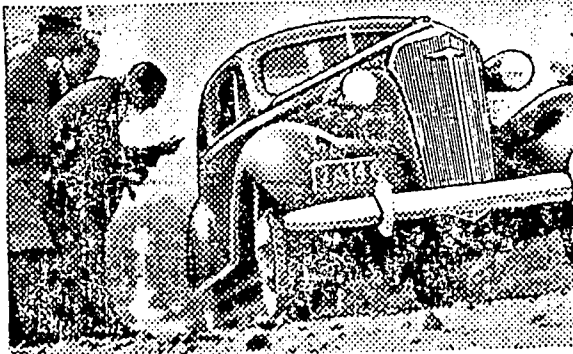

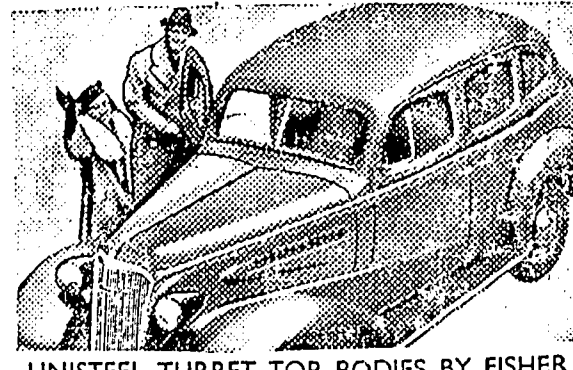

Synopsis of Land Act

PRE-EMPTIONS
 VACANT, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occupation and improvement.
 Full information concerning Pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C. Bureau of Provincial Information, Victoria, or any Government Agent.
 Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes within reasonable distance of road, school and marketing facilities and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 5,000 board feet per acre east of the Coast Range and 8,750 feet per acre west of that Range.
 Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division in which the land applied for is situated, on printed forms obtained from the Commissioner.
 Pre-emption must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.
 Pre-emption carrying part time conditions of occupation are also granted.

PURCHASE ON LEASE
 Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes. Minimum price of first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land, \$2.50 per acre. Further information is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."
 As a partial relief measure, reverted lands may be acquired by purchase in ten equal instalments, with the first payment suspended for two years, provided taxes are paid when due and improvements are made during the first two years of not less than 10% of the approved value.
 Mill, factory or industrial sites on timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased on the conditions including payment of summate.
 Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtained after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.
 For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or a company.
 Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under grazing regulations amended from time to time to meet varying conditions. Annual grazing permits are issued based on certain monthly rates per head of stock. Priority in grazing privileges is given to resident stock owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free or partially free permits available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.
