THE HOUSEWIFE

Lemon Pie Filling
3 eggs, separated

2-3 cup granulated sugar
4 tablespoons cornstarch
Pine of salt
Rind and juice 2 lemons
1 1/2 cups boiling water
1 tablespoon butter
Mix the sugar, cornstarch and salt together. Add well beaten egg yolks and juice and rind of lemons. Add the boiling water, mixing thoroughly, and cook the mixture in top of double boiler over boiling water until it is thick. Add the butter, blending well and cool before filling pie shell.
Make a meringue of the egg whites and 9 tablespoons of sugar. Pipe on top of pie and brown in a moderate oven.

Cream Pie

2 cups milk
1-2 cup granulated sugar
2 eggs
4 level teaspoons cornstarch
1-4 teaspoon salt
1-2 teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon butter
Heat milk in double boiler to boiling point. Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt together. Beat eggs slightly and mix with cornstarch and sugar. Blend thoroughly. Add to hot milk and stir constantly until thickened. Add vanilla and butter and beat for one minute. Cool thoroughly and fill cooked pie shell with the mixture. Serve plain or with whipped cream.

Salmon Casserole

1 16-oz. tin of salmon
1-4 cup rice crispies, crushed
1-2 cup grated cheese
2 hard boiled eggs, diced
1-2 cup cream of tomato soup
1 teaspoon vinegar
Butter four tablespoons of the crushed rice crispies. Combine all remaining ingredients and mix well. Place in buttered casserole, top with buttered crispies, and bake in moderate oven until heated through and brown on top.

Fruit Pound Cake

1 cup butter
1 cup fruit sugar
3 eggs
2 1/4 cups flour
1/2 cup currants
1 cup sultana raisins
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 cup mixed peel, finely cut
Grated rind of 1 lemon.
1/2 teaspoon salt
Cream butter, add sugar gradually.

then eggs one at a time. Beat in well. Dredge fruit with some of the flour, and add flour, fruit and lemon rind. Line a square tin (6 inches by 6 inches) with heavy greased paper. Bake in slow oven for 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 hours.

Meat and Vegetable Pie

tablespoons shortening
1 medium sized onion, grated
1 to 1 1-2 cups cold meat cut in cubes
1 cup thin cream sauce or left-over gravy
1 cup cold chopped carrots
1 cup left over or canned pear
1-2 teaspoon salt
1-4 teaspoon pepper
2 cubes concentrated meat extract
1-2 cup diced celery (optional)
Grate onion and add to shortening in the frying pan. Add the meat and heat through thoroughly. Add the sauce or gravy to which has been the extract cubes (dissolved in a little boiling water), seasonings and vegetables. Turn into a well greased baking dish and cover with pastry or buttered cracker crumbs.

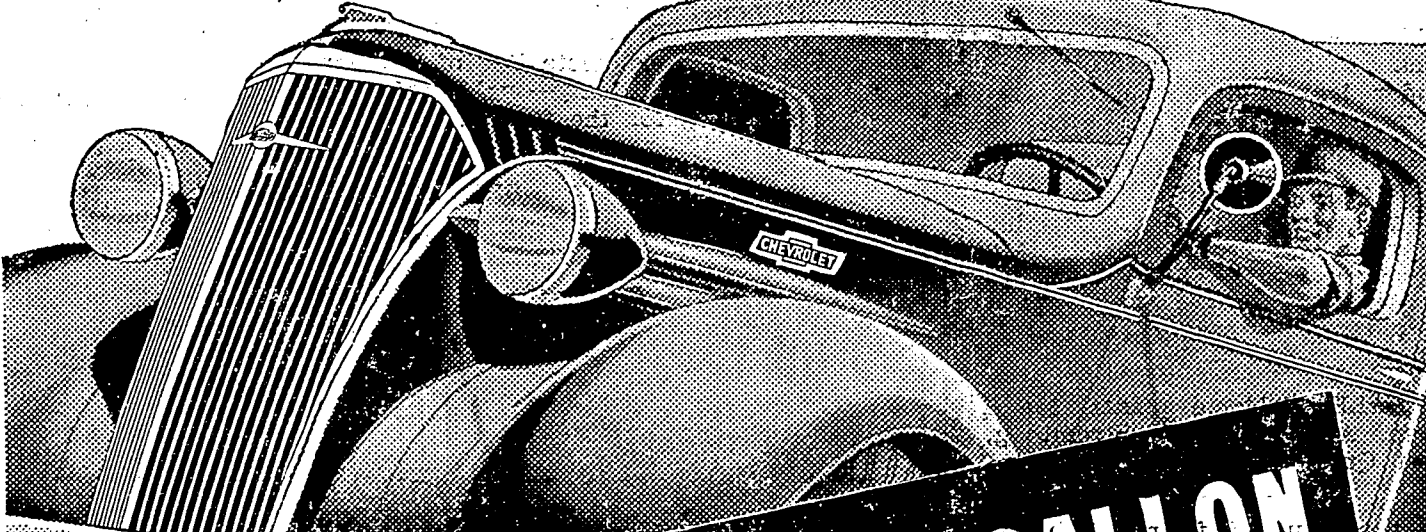

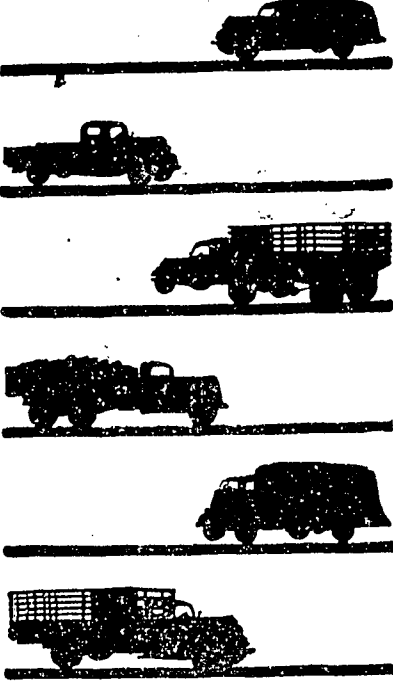

Board of Trade Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Quesnel Board of Trade was held in the Cariboo Hotel on Wednesday, May 19. The secretary read the minutes of the last meeting which were adopted. A letter was read from the Parent-Teacher Association asking for support for adequate playing fields. The secretary was instructed to reply that while the Board of Trade had every sympathy with the request, they believed that at the present time there are many facilities in Quesnel on the park site, on the baseball grounds and in the school playgrounds for the children.

Earl Malcolm reported for the publicity committee. He stated that they had been unable to display the large relief map at Blaine as there was not a proper site available. However, at Blaine there was a gentleman very much interested in this country and he would give it all the publicity possible. Mr. Baynes of Vancouver had been in touch with the Hudsons Bay Co. in that city and they had given permission for the map to be displayed at the company's parking space on Seymour St. It has been arranged that all Boards of Trade in the interior served by the map contribute \$25 per annum towards upkeep, lighting, etc. The Vancouver Automobile Club is doing well towards the interior this year, and it has been arranged to erect new signs and posts along the highways. It is also planned to bring out a magazine featuring articles on the country.

A vote of censure on absent members was passed and the secretary instructed to write those members of the Board not in attendance, asking them to make an effort to be more regular in the future.

Two guests were present, Messrs. Stirling and Robertson of Vancouver.

The Rev. W. Evan Fullerton returned to Quesnel on Friday evening after spending the past two weeks at the coast.

Two bad corners, about three miles from town on the north road, which have been the scenes of many car smashups, are being straightened out by the public works department at the present time. The work will greatly improve the road and lessen the driving danger in that vicinity.

TACOMA, Wash.—After a gun battle with four policemen, Vernon "Blackie" Campbell was riddled with six bullets. He died later in a Tacoma hospital. He was the man who escaped with Gordon Fawcett from Okalla prison. He had taken part in a hold-up in Seattle and one in Tacoma.

Walter Smith, who has operated the Tire Hospital here for the past couple of years, is leaving for Williams Lake shortly, where he will work for the Ford Garage.
