**Parent-Teacher Ass'n  
Has Fine Convention**

At the Parent-Teacher Association meeting held on May 18, Mrs. Freeman gave her report on the convention held at the Georgia Hotel, Vancouver, which she attended at a delegate from Quesnel. The theme of the convention was "Character, the Key to Successful Living." Its highlights, briefly outlined, were friendliness and informality yet a businesslike manner of despatching matters in hand. Evidence of a serious purpose and the importance of Parent-Teacher Association work became more widely recognized; a marked and frequently expressed appreciation of democracy stressed by many speakers.

Following an opening address by Mayor Miller of Vancouver, Dr. Weir, representing the Government Department of Education, Mr. Morgan of the B. C. Teachers' Federation, and Mr. McLaren of the Vancouver School Board, spoke.

Mrs. Delmage, a past president of the Association mentioned the rapid growth of the Parent-Teacher movement, and pointed out that at the present time there are 94 groups affiliated with the parent body, twelve new associations, and also some in Victoria not affiliated. There were 66 associations represented at the convention, 29 of these being from outside of Vancouver. Quesnel and West Quesnel were the farthest away from Vancouver, and West Quesnel was the newest affiliation. Dr. England spoke briefly on adult education.

On the morning of the second day of the convention officers for the ensuing year were elected. Mr. Black was re-elected for a second term as president. At luncheon Rabbi Cass spoke on the subject of "Character, Education and Social Change." In the afternoon the speakers were Mr. E. J. Robinson of the Vancouver Public Library, Mr. J. R. Pollack, director of visual education in Vancouver, and Mr. Ian Eisenhart, director of physical and recreational education.

On the last day of the convention Rev. J. D. Hobden spoke of the work done by the John Howard Society on behalf of the prisoners in the Province. Mr. Jordan spoke on the matter of venereal disease and the manner in which education would combat this social enemy.

On May 27th Mrs. Freeman presented her report to the West Quesnel meeting.

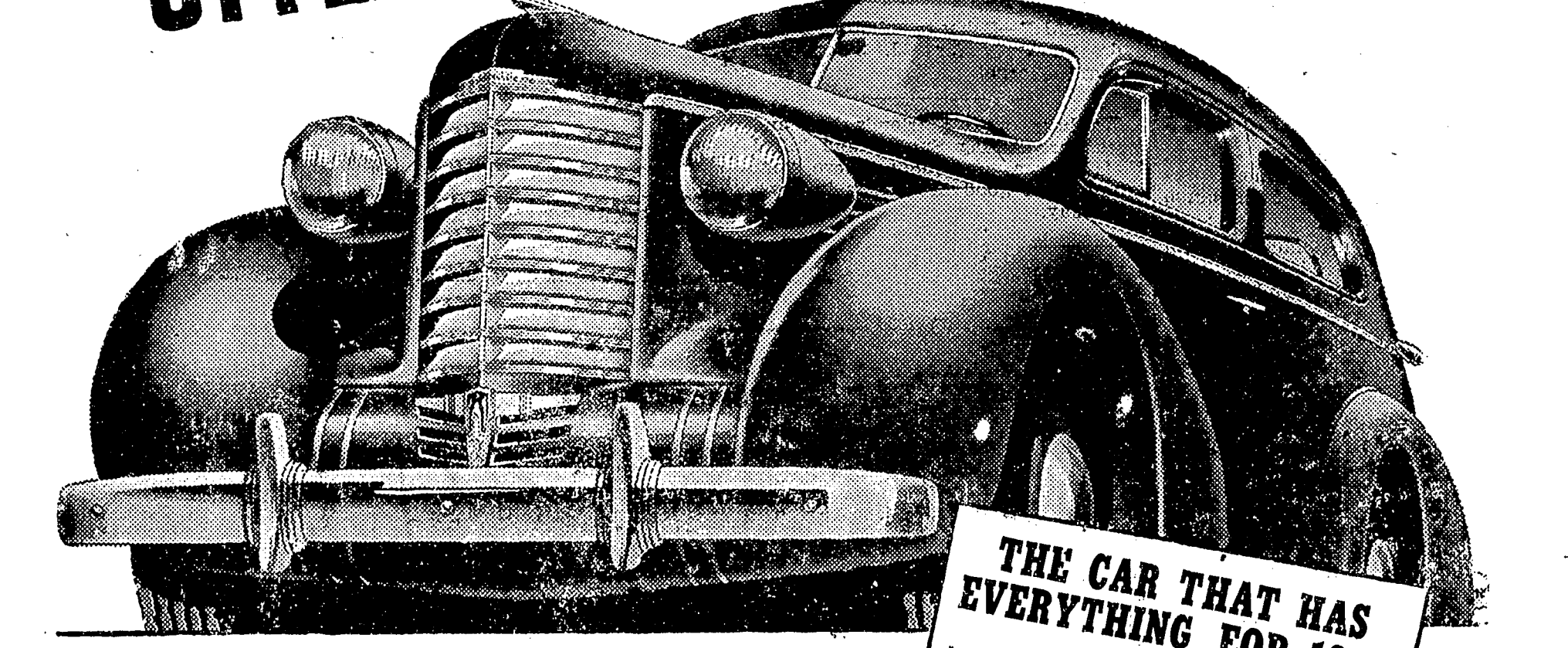

A sluggish week on the cattle market with very light receipts, prices have remained steady which may remain for another two weeks or so, when the price breaks due to the advent of grass cattle. The break should only be slight as there is no abundant supply anywhere in sight.

Steer prices on this side of the line are about \$1.00 per hundred too high to ship across the line, as grass cattle in that country have been moving in fair numbers, and will increase from now on. It would be well for ranchers to keep an eye on their dry cows and heifers, which should be the first cattle to put on flesh and fat enough to market. It is not suggested that there is any hurry, nevertheless when they are ready they should be shipped out of the way before too big a volume starts. Up to date there have been 3,110 steers, heifers and cows sold since January 1 this year on this market, as against 2,500 for the same period in 1936.
