**THE HOUSEWIFE**

**Tomato Salad Jelly**  
1 cup boiled canned tomatoes  
1 cup boiling water  
1 tablespoon gelatin  
3 tablespoons cold water  
1 teaspoon tiny mint leaves  
1 teaspoon chopped onion.  
Salt  
Paprika  
Black Pepper  
10 chopped stuffed olives  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
Strain the boiled canned tomatoes and add boiling water. Pour the mixture over the gelatin which has been softened in cold water. Allow the liquid to cool and begin to jell. Then stir in the tiny mint leaves, onion, salt, paprika, pepper, olives and lemon juice. Pour into freezing tray but do not allow to freeze too hard. When it is firm an thoroughly chilled turn the cubes out onto a bed of crisp lettuce leaves and cress. Serve with generous portions of mayonnaise mixed with equal parts of stiffly beaten cream.

**Cabbage Salad**  
1/4 cup butter  
1 egg, separated  
2 tablespoons sugar  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon mustard  
1/4 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 cup vinegar  
1 pint shredded cabbage  
Cream butter and beat into it first the yolk and then the white of one egg. Add the sugar, mustard, salt and paprika. Then pour on very gradually beating constantly, the hot vinegar. Cook over hot water until the mixture thickens a little. It should be like thick cream. Let this cool and then stir in a generous pint of finely shredded cabbage.

**Molded Chicken Salad**  
2 teaspoons gelatin  
1/2 cup cold water  
2 cups cold chicken, diced  
1/2 cup celery, diced  
1/4 cup chopped green pepper  
1/4 cup stuffed olives, chopped  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Soak gelatin in cold water 5 minutes and dissolve over boiling water. Add remaining ingredients. Put into ring mold or individual molds. Chill thoroughly. When set unmold on crisp lettuce and serve with mayonnaise or 1000 Islands dressing.

**Mayonnaise Dressing**  
1 teaspoon mustard  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 egg yolks or 1 whole egg  
Dash of cayenne pepper  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 tablespoons vinegar  
1 1/2 cups olive or salad oil  
Mix dry ingredients, add egg yolks. When well mixed add 1/2 teaspoon vinegar. Add oil very gradually, drop by drop at first, stirring constantly with a fork until mixture begins to thicken. Thin with vinegar or lemon juice and add oil and acid alternately until all is used, beating constantly with a rotary egg beater. Do not add the oil too quickly at first or the dressing will have a curdled appearance.

**HAY FEVER**

Hay fever is caused by the irritation to the mucous membrane of the nose and throat from the pollen or dust of plants and grasses by persons sensitive to such irritation. The offending plants and trees, grasses and weeds, and the particular offender in a given case may be recognized by skin tests. Pollen, or dust, to be effective in causing hay fever in sensitive persons must contain an excitant to this condition; it must be capable of being carried by winds and for considerable distances; the source must be abundant and the plants widely distributed.

In the early spring trees carry the causative pollens. Then come the grasses, say about June, and then the weeds in the Autumn. On the American continent the wind-pollinated trees are those carrying catkins, such as the poplar, oak, birch, walnut, beech, hazel and alder. Others are the maples, ash, hackberry, sycamore and mulberry. The willow pollen is the only one of these not carried by the winds. Trees producing perfect flowers, such as the elm and nequite are also wind-pollinated. On the Western Prairies the poplar is the chief offender among trees, and timothy is the worst of the grasses.

Dr. Heber C. Jamieson of Edmonton, writing in the Canadian Medical Association Journal, defines the three hay fever areas of the Province of Alberta. One of these stretches from the Red Deer River to the northern boundary. A second comprises the southern section of this region with its upper limit to the Peace River country, while the third extends from the Red Deer south to the international boundary.

Of trees, the poplar is the important one so far as hay fever in Alberta is concerned. From mid-April on is the season for its ravages. Timothy pollinates from the middle of June. Weeds are the chief causes of Autumn hay fever. These comprise the rag weed family and the thistle family. The effects of these are found from July onward. Golden rod, popularly supposed to excite hay fever, has been exonerated.

The sufferer from hay fever sees the first signs in what appears to be a violent cold in the head which may be associated with asthma. There are attacks of sneezing, headache and lassitude. Old persons are practically exempt. The important point is the prevention of the condition. In most cases this can be done by the use of skin tests to discover the pollen or dust to which the individual is subject. This being done a vaccine or antitoxin may be prepared which is effective in the majority of cases.

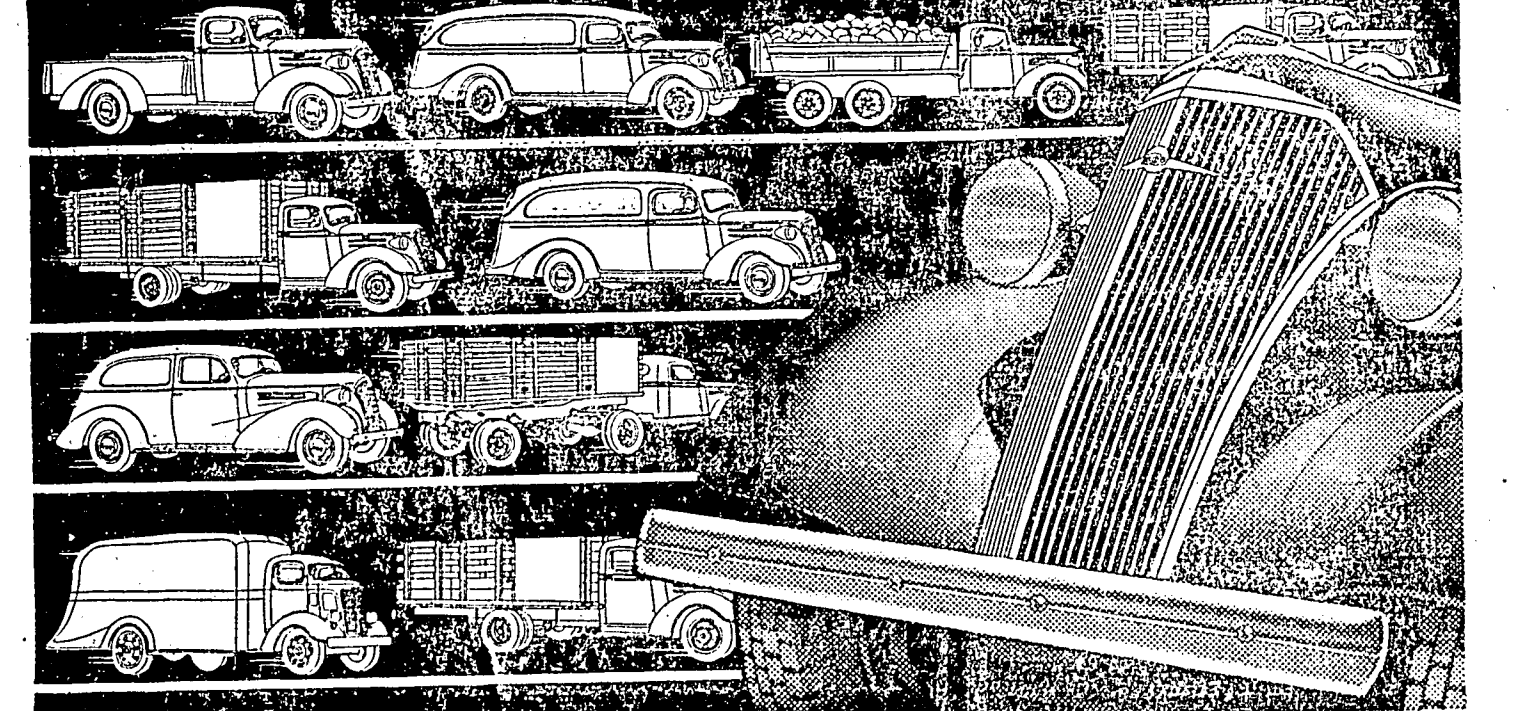
