THE HOUSEWIFE

Plain Griddle Cakes
2 1/2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
3 tablespoons flour
2 cups milk
1 egg
2 tablespoons melted butter
Mix and sift dry ingredients; beat egg, add milk and add to first mixture. Beat thoroughly and add the melted butter. Drop by spoonfuls on a greased hot griddle. When puffed and full of bubbles and cooked on the eyes, turn and cook on the other side. Serve at once.

Cake Pancakes
1 teaspoon melted butter
1 egg
1/2 cup sugar
2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
Pinch of salt
Pinch of Soda
1 1/2 cups of milk
1 tablespoon corn syrup
Mix and sift dry ingredients. Beat egg well and add sugar and corn syrup to it. Add the sifted dry ingredients alternately with the milk to the egg mixture. Lastly add the melted butter. Fry in frying pan as you would pancakes, and serve cold spread with butter.

Filling
2 tablespoons cocoa
1 1/4 tablespoons cornstarch
1 cup hot water
2-3 cup granulated sugar
1 tablespoon butter
Pinch of salt
Mix the cocoa, cornstarch, sugar and salt together. Add hot water, blending thoroughly, cook over hot water until thick and cornstarch is well cooked. Add butter, blending well and cool before filling cake.
