2 cups flour
Cream butter, add sugar gradually, creaming all the time. Add unbeaten egg and beat mixture well. Add flour alternately with sour milk in which soda has been stirred. With the last half cup of flour add the raisins, (flouring them well), and lastly add the chopped orange. Blend well. Bake in a cake tin in a moderate oven for 35 to 40 minutes.

WHITE CAKE OR SNOW CAKE
1/2 cup butter
1 cup sugar
1/2 cup milk
1 2-3 cups flour
2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
2 1/2 teaspoons salt
2 egg whites
1/2 teaspoon vanilla or 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
Beat egg whites until stiff, add 1/2 cup sugar, and set aside. Cream butter, add 1/2 cup sugar gradually while beating constantly. Mix and sift dry ingredients and add alternately with milk. Fold in egg whites. Add flavoring. Bake 45 minutes.

1 cup honey
1 cup butter
2 eggs
1/2 teaspoon allspice
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ginger
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon mace
4 cups flour
2 teaspoons soda
1 cup sour milk
1 cup raisins
1/2 teaspoon salt
Cream butter well with honey and sugar, add eggs one at a time and beat well. Add sour milk and dry ingredients sifted several times. Add raisins mixed with a little flour, last. Bake in a moderate oven about one hour.

3 eggs, well beaten
2 1/2 cups flour
2 1/4 teaspoons baking powder
2-3 teaspoon soda
2-3 Vanilla and almond flavoring
1/2 teaspoon each Pinch of salt
Sift flour, measure and sift again with the baking powder, soda and salt. Cream sour cream and sugar well together, add well beaten eggs, mixing thoroughly. Fold in dry ingredients, blending well, and lastly the flavoring. Bake in a moderate oven until done.

Macaroon Cake

2-3 cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
1 3/4 cups pastry flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup milk
1 1/2 teaspoons blended flavorings—(almond and vanilla)
Sift flour, baking powder and salt

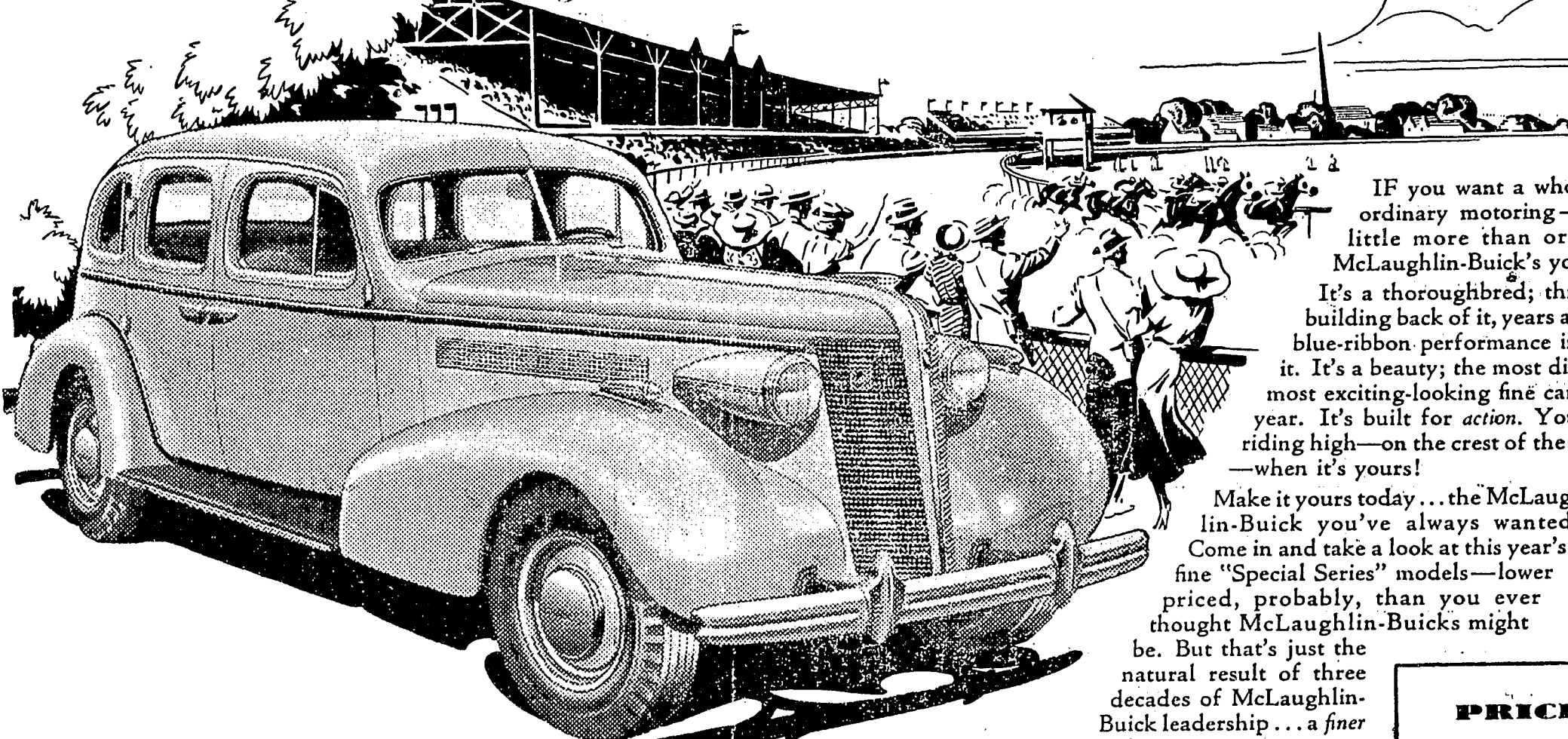
