TOMATO COCKTAILS

Now that tomatoes are plentiful, the following recipes taken from the circular "Tomato Juice and Tomato Cocktails" issued by the Dominion

Department of Agriculture may prove interesting.

Tomato Cocktail (No. 1)

- 15 ripe tomatoes
 - 1 cup chopped celery
 - 1/2 cup chopped onions
 - 2 tablespoons vinegar
 - 3 sweet green peppers
 - 1 sweet red pepper
 - 2 tablespoons salt
 - 1/4 cup sugar
- Mash and cut tomatoes, but do not

peel. Chop the peppers finely. Mix tomatoes, celery, onions, peppers and salt together. Boil for one-half hour. Strain through a coarse sieve. Add the vinegar and sugar. Boil three minutes. Seal in sterilized jars.

Tomato Cocktail (No. 2)

- 1 bushel tomatoes
- 1 small head celery
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon white pepper
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 4 teaspoons salt

Boil all together for 20 minutes. Strain and boil 5 minutes. Bottle and seal.

Tomato Cocktail (No. 3)

- 1 No. 2 half-can tomatoes or 1 pint jar home-canned juice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon minced onion
- 1 tablespoon minced celery

Mix all together and let stand at least one hour. Strain and chill before serving.

Tomato Cocktail (No. 4)

- 1 No. 2 half-can tomatoes
- 1/2 teaspoon minced parsley
- 3 cloves
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon white pepper
- 1 teaspoon minced onion
- 1/2 teaspoon vinegar

Add the ingredients to the tomatoes, boil together five minutes, strain and chill. The circular on Tomato Juice and Tomato Cocktails may be obtained free on request from the Publicity and Extension Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.

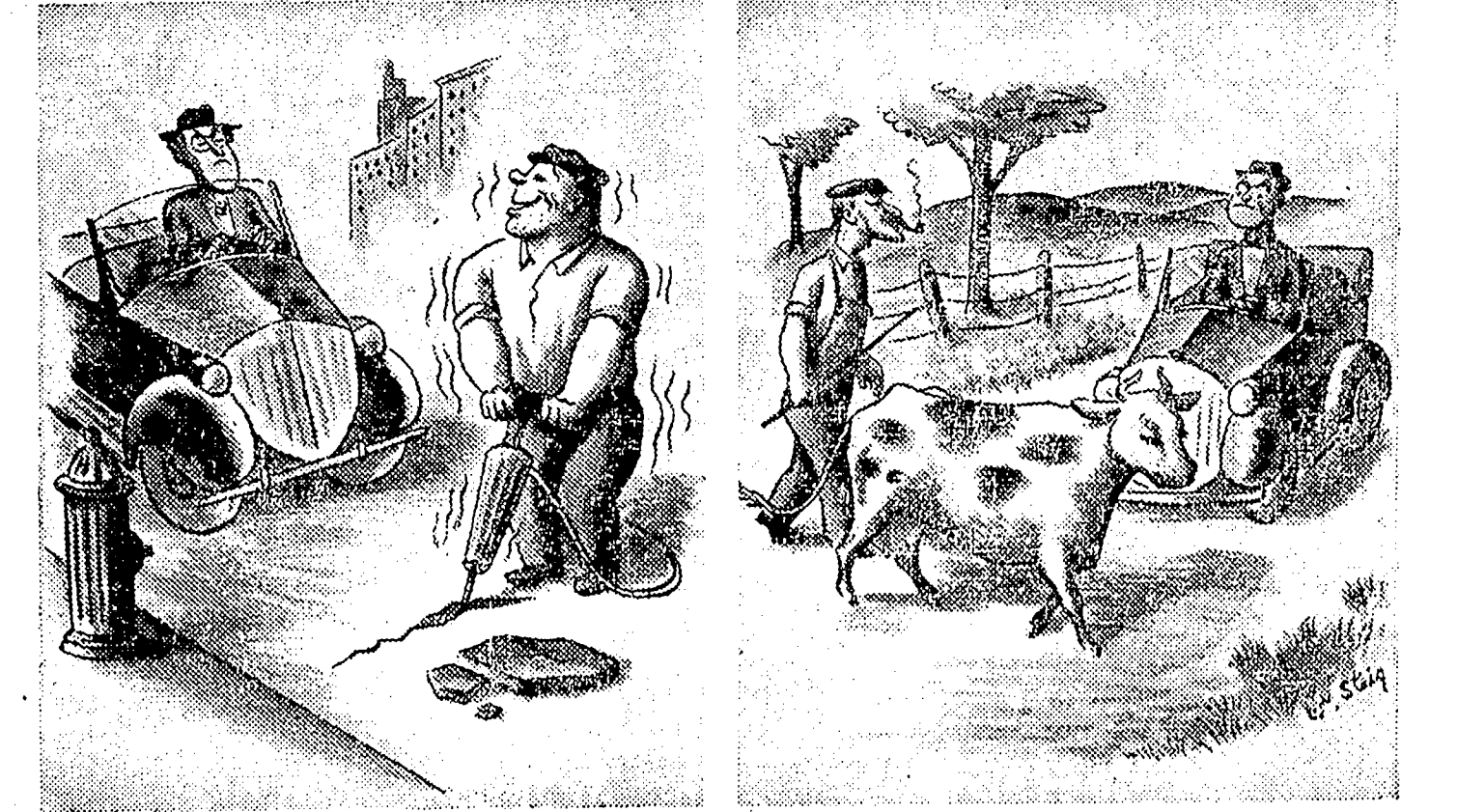
