HOUGHTALING

teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon
soda, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon
cinnamon, 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg, 1/2
teaspoon cloves, 1/2 cup butter or
other shortening, 1-3 cups (1 can)
sweetened condensed milk, 2-3 cup
water.

Sift flour once, add baking powder,
soda, salt and spices and sift again.
Cream shortening. Add the dry in-
gredients to the shortening, alternately
with the sweetened condensed
milk, which has been blended with
the water. Beat until the batter is
smooth. Turn into a buttered loaf pan
(8x4x3 inches) or square pan (9-
inch) and bake in moderate oven
(350 degrees F.) about 40 minutes.

LEMON MERINGUE FROSTING

1-3 cups (1 can) sweetened con-
densed milk, 2 tablespoons lemon
juice, 1 egg white, stiffly beaten.

Blend together sweetened con-
densed milk and lemon juice and stir
until mixture thickens. Fold in stiffly
beaten egg white. Spread on baked
cake. Bake in a moderate oven ten
minutes or until a delicate brown or
place very low in broiler under a
slow flame. Broil until surface be-
comes delicate brown. Cool. Makes
enough to cover top and sides of loaf
cake generously or about two dozen
cup cakes.

BANANA CAKE

One-half cup white sugar, 1/2 cup
brown sugar, 1/2 cup butter, 2 eggs,
1 cup mashed bananas (about three),
1 small teaspoon soda mixed in ban-
anas, 2 tablespoons sweet milk, 1 1/2
cups flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder.
Combine ingredients in above order
and bake in moderately hot oven.

NEVER-FAIL ICING

Two cups brown sugar, 2 table-
spoons cream, 2 tablespoons butter,
2 tablespoons hot water.

After cooking until it boils all over,
time it for 2 minutes. Beat and add
flavoring.

THREE IDEAS FOR SANDWICHES

Three-Tier Sandwiches: Cut the
bread in thin, even slices, in matching
thickness. Spread each slice with soft-
ened butter, and trim. Between the
first two spread Paris-Pate, moisten-
ed with mayonnaise, with a little
cress or a lettuce leaf put between them.
On top of this sandwich place a
thin slice of tomato (well drained).
Put a little mayonnaise on the to-
mato or, if preferred sprinkle with
salt and pepper. Then place on the
third slice of bread. Cut in desired
shapes.

Three-Tier Cucumber Sandwiches:
Make the same as above, substituting
thin slices of cucumber for the to-
mato.

Ribbon Sandwiches: These sand-
wiches are made of four slices of
bread, two white and two brown, cut
half-inch thick and trimmed. Butter
one side of each slice. On one brown
slice place some cream or cottage
cheese, to which has been added
some pimento olives, a taste of chop-
ped onion; then cover with a slice of
white bread. Spread this slice with
Paris-Pate, mixed with a little chop-
ped parsley; cover with a slice of
brown bread, spread with the cheese
mixture, and then the last white
slice. Cover with wax paper and put
a weight on top for an hour or so;
then slice downwards as you would
a cake.

CHICKEN TERRAPIN

Two cups diced, cold roast or
boiled chicken, 3 chopped hard-
cooked eggs, 1-16 teaspoon cayenne
pepper, 1 dessertspoon minced pars-
ley, 1 teaspoon grated onion, 1 cup
chicken gravy or cream sauce, 1/2
teaspoon salt. Mix well, place in glass
casserole, well-greased, and cover
with 1 inch highly seasoned mashed
potatoes. Brush top with beaten egg,
and press tiny, cooked sausages into
it. Brown quickly in a hot oven and
serve from the casserole.

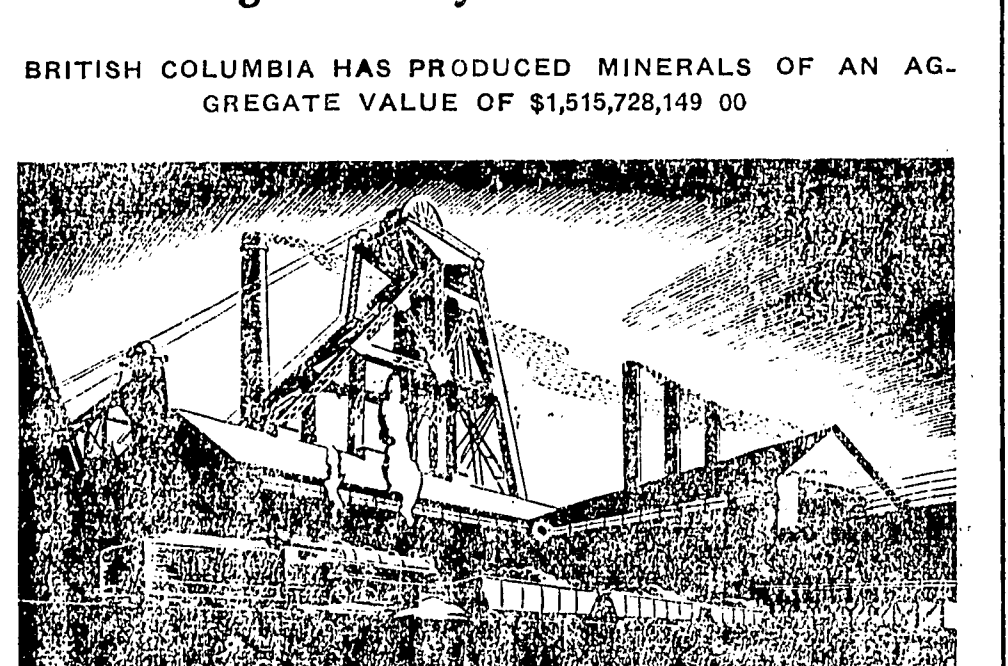

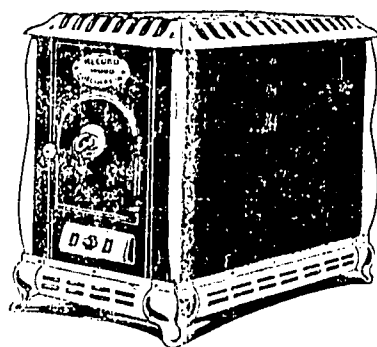

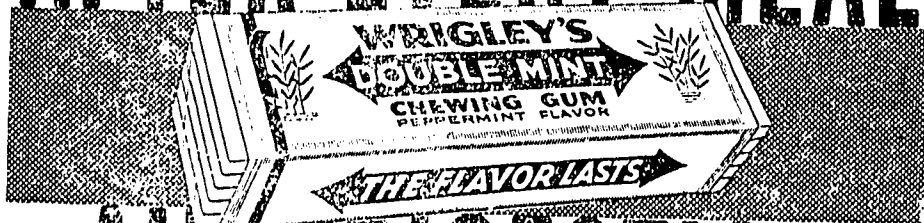
