FEDERAL MEMBER ASKS SETTLING OF N. CARIBOO

(Continued from page one)

Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Gardiner was to make a trip with me into the Peace River Block and into other parts of the Cariboo riding during this summer. The drought situation, unfortunately, forced him to return to Ottawa from Calgary and rendered it impossible for him to make the extended trip with me into my riding. He did succeed later on in making a rushed trip into the Peace River Block. On account of my illness it was impossible for me to accompany him. Immediately previous to his hurried trip into the Peace River Block in August of this year, I wrote him, among other things, as follows: "There are portions of the Cariboo riding, especially the Peace River Block, and other districts along the Canadian National Railways which can be made to fit very nicely into the general scheme of things resulting from weather and other conditions. . . . The agricultural possibilities of the Cariboo riding are really great with reference to both livestock and field crops, and I should be grateful if you could have your different officials make surveys designed to discover these different possibilities."

In addition to the above, I have discussed the matter with the Provincial Minister of Agriculture, Honourable K. C. MacDonald, and with Honourable A. Wells Gray, Minister of Lands. I know personally of certain Alberta farmers (some of them former constituents of mine when I was in the Alberta legislature) who hold their properties under clear title without mortgages and who have sufficient funds with which to carry on, but who feel that they are through with farming in their portion of the prairie. I think that some of these men would be very glad to consider settlement in our part of British Columbia. I have written of this to the Provincial Ministers of Land and Agriculture with whom I hope to have a conference on the subject before long. I have also discussed the matter very fully with Mrs. T. W. Sutherland of Wells, B.C., one of the members of the National Employment Commission. Mrs. Sutherland is now on her way to Ottawa and on my behalf will make representations concerning colonization both to the National Employment Commission and to the Federal Minister of Agriculture.

I shall be glad to have your views on the matter also those of the officers of the Associated Boards of Trade.
