WE CALL IT PROGRESS

That summer we were sitting around the campfire smoking our pipes and talking about this and that—myself and the bushy-bearded old trapper. He was telling me about the good old times, and in his opinion the Cariboo was a good country until the railroad, trucks and cars came. There was plenty of work and money to go around, and now the gas buggies have put the country on the hummer. His argument was expressed with finality—there was no room for argument!

I just sat there looking into the fire and listening to the crackling of the logs and the gurgling of the old trapper's pipe. After a time I remembered another camp fire, ten years before on the old Yukon Telegraph Trail. I was sitting that night across the camp fire from the old Cariboo packer "Cariboo Jim." He must have been at that time very close to 90 years of age, and his weatherbeaten, wrinkled face was the color of old saddle leather, or perhaps a shade darker. He was also telling me about the Cariboo in the good old days, and from his speech, which was a jargon of English, Spanish, Chinook and the Lorn only knows what else, I made out that Cariboo was a good country when they had pack trails there only. But when the Government built roads in the 1860's and the freighters started to use oxen and wagons, the bottom fell out of the freight rates and the country has been no good since. So there you are. Figure it out.
