Sift together 1 1/2 cups flour; 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Beat 1 egg; add 2-3 cup

milk, and stir into dry ingredients. Pare, core and cut two sour apples into small pieces and stir these into the batter. Drop, by tablespoons, into deep fat and fry to a delicate brown. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Jelly Roll
Two eggs; 3/4 cup sugar; grated rind of lemon; 1 cup flour; 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 3 tablespoons milk.

Beat eggs, add sugar and beat well. Add lemon rind. Sift flour with baking powder and salt; add alternately with milk. Bake 15 to 20 minutes at a temperature of about 350 degrees in greased bread pan and turn out on damp cloth. Spread with jelly and roll. Dredge top with powdered sugar.

Cheese Muffins
Two cups flour; 3 tablespoons of baking powder; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1/4 cup grated cheese; 2 tablespoons of butter, melted; 1 egg; 1 cup milk.

Mix and sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add grated cheese. Mix in milk and beaten egg, then add butter. Fill tiny buttered muffin tins about 1-3 full of batter. On tins drop a little marmalade or jelly. Cover with batter, filling tins about 2-3 full. Bake in a moderate oven about 15 minutes. Serve hot.

gar; 1 cup mashed bananas; 1/2 cups pastry flour; 1 teaspoon soda; 1 teaspoon nutmeg; 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Cream butter and sugar; add egg well beaten and stir in mashed bananas. Sift dry ingredients together and add alternately with soda dissolved in a little hot water.

Bake in greased small muffin tins in hot oven for 15 minutes. Cool and sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Hot Meat Balls
Mix together 1 cup cold minced cooked beef; 1 cup finely mashed potatoes; 1 tablespoon each of minced onion, minced parsley and finely chopped sweet green pepper. Form into small flat cakes and fry until browned on both sides. Garnish with pieces of parsley and small radishes if obtainable.

Salmon Souffle
Half cup milk, 1/2 cup soft crumbs, 1 pound can salmon, salt and pepper, 4 egg yolks, 4 egg whites.

Heat milk, add crumbs and let stand for a few minutes. Combine with the flaked salmon, salt, pepper and beaten egg yolks. Fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites.

Pour into a greased baking dish and bake in a moderate oven about 45 minutes. Serve at once.

Cranberry Prune Whip
Half a cup of cranberry sauce, egg whites, 6 tablespoons sugar, pinch of salt, 1/2 cup cooked prune pulp, 1/4 cup whipping cream.

Beat the egg whites until stiff, fold in sugar, salt and fruit pulp. Last of all, add the cream, whipped stiff and chill in the refrigerator. For a hot pudding, omit the cream and bake the whip in a warm oven - degrees - for about 25 minutes. Serve the cream on top of the pudding.

Apricot Ice Cream
Three-quarters cup sugar, 3/4 cup water, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 3 egg whites, 2 cups whipping cream. 1 1/2 cup canned apricots.

Cook sugar and water until syrup spins a thread. Carefully pour over beaten egg whites to which salt has been added. Beat until cool. Beat cream and fold it into the meringue. Add cut apricots and freeze.

Fluffy Icing
Two egg whites; 1 1/2 cups white granulated sugar; 1 1/2 teaspoons corn syrup; 1/4 cup boiling water; few grains of salt; 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Place egg whites, unbeaten, sugar, water, corn syrup, and salt in the top of a double boiler and beat with dory beater until well blended. Place over rapidly boiling water, and beat continually for 7 minutes or until mixture will stand in peaks. Remove from heat and from over water, add vanilla, and continue beating until thick enough to spread.

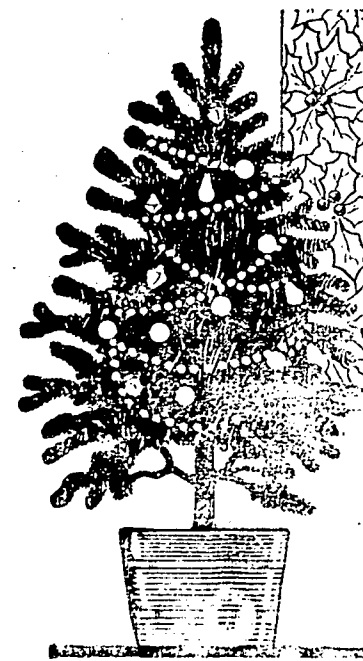
