THE HOUSEWIFE

Bean Chowder

One pound dried red beans; 1 large onion; 1 number 2½ can tomatoes; 4 potatoes, peeled and diced; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 green pepper, diced; 4 weiners.

Wash beans and soak overnight in 2 quarts water. Drain. Add 2 quarts fresh water, sliced onion and tomatoes. Cook gently one hour or until beans are tender. Add potatoes, salt and green pepper. Cut weiners in quarter inch slices. Add to chowder and cook 15 minutes longer.

Baked Bean Ham Rolls

Prepare for hearty appetites when you serve this dish. Men like it. Six thin slices of ham (baked or boiled), 2 tablespoons prepared mustard, 2 cups baked beans, 6 slices of bacon.

Spread ham slices with mustard arrange baked beans at one end of each slice and roll as tightly as possible. Wrap each roll in a slice of bacon, fasten securely with toothpick and broil under high flame, turning until bacon is crisp on all sides. Serve hot.

Creamed Baked Potatoes

Six large baked potatoes; 3 tablespoons butter; 3 tablespoons flour; ½ teaspoon salt; ½ teaspoon pepper; 1½ cups milk; ½ cup grated cheese. Peel and dice potatoes. Melt butter. Blend in flour and add seasoning.

Add milk slowly, stirring constantly and cook over low heat 5 minutes until thick and smooth. Add cheese. When melted, add potatoes, cook over hot water until thoroughly heated.

Hot Potato Salad

Cook eight medium sized potatoes until tender, but not too soft, leaving skins on while cooking. Peel and slice while hot, add 2 chopped hard cooked eggs. Fry until browned 1½ cups diced breakfast bacon, together with ½ cup minced onions. Drain reverse bacon fat and add bacon and onion to potatoes. Add bacon fat to one well beaten egg, also 4 tablespoons vinegar, more if desired; 2 teaspoons salt and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Pour this sauce over the potato mixture and heat in a double boiler.

Luncheon Sandwiches

Flaked fish salmon, tuna or crab meat with minced cabbage and salad dressing, in long rolls.

Ground raw carrot, chopped cabbage and celery, with or without ground peanuts, mayonnaise.

One cup grated cheese, 4 tablespoons chopped sweet pickle or sweet relish and mayonnaise to moisten. Serve on Graham bread.

Equal parts of cream cheese and apricot pulp blended together with mayonnaise. Equal parts of cream cheese and devilled ham blended together.

Baked Ham With Cranberries

Three cups cranberries; 1½ cups strained honey; 2 tablespoons whole cloves; 2 slices ham (¾ to 1 inch thick)

Mix cranberries and honey; gash edges of fat on ham. Place one slice of ham in baking dish. Spread the centre with the mixture of cranberries and honey. Top with second slice. Cover with remaining cranberry and honey mixture. Garnish with whole cloves. Bake until done in a moderate oven about 1½ hours, basting occasionally with liquid in dish.

ISLAND MOUNTAIN GOLD REPLACEMENT ORE OPENING UP NICELY

Production at Island Mountain Gold in November was almost identical with the October figure. Officials report that work on the new low level 500 feet below the main haulage tunnel, continues to open high grade limestone replacement ore of good width. After exploring a new orebody of good length, work on this level recently entered another body showing the same high values. Ore from Island Mountain replacement bodies averages over 1 ounce per ton in gold as milled.

November output at Island Mountain was 1,534 ounces worth \$53,690 from 3,798 tons. This compares with 1,536 ounces worth \$53,777 from 3,739 tons in October.
