THE HOUSEWIFE

Welsh Rarebit

1 tablespoon butter
1/4 cup rich milk or thin cream
2 cups grated cheese
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon mustard
Few grains cayenne

1 egg
Make a sauce of butter, flour and milk. Add grated cheese and seasonings. Pour some of hot sauce over beaten egg. Return to double boiler and cook a minute or two. Serve on toast or crackers.

Oyster Stew

1 pint oysters
4 cups milk and oyster liquor
3 tablespoons butter
1/4 cup cracker crumbs
Salt and pepper

Carefully pick over oysters. Heat milk and oyster liquor. Season with salt and pepper. When scalded add butter and oysters. Cook until oysters are plump and edges begin to curl. Add cracker crumbs just before serving.

Creamy Eggs on Toast

3 eggs
3 teaspoons butter
1/4 teaspoon salt
Few grains of pepper
2-3 cup milk

Beat eggs slightly. Add butter, seasonings and milk. Cook over hot water. As liquid coagulates around sides and bottom draw it away with a spoon. Continue until all of the mixture is cooked. Serve on toast. Garnish with parsley.

Toasted Ham and Cheese Snack

Place thin layer of ham and thin layer of cheese between two layers of buttered toast. Serve hot with chili sauce or catsup.

Creamed Chicken on Toast

2 tablespoons butter
1 cup milk
2 tablespoons flour
1 1/2 cups freshly cooked or canned chicken, cut in pieces
Salt and pepper

Melt butter. Blend in flour and seasonings. Add milk gradually and stir until mixture thickens. Cook for three minutes. Add chicken and heat thoroughly. Serve on toast.

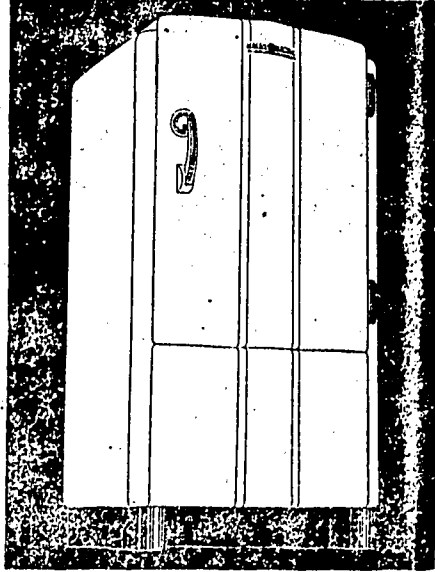
