## B.C. Operator Tells of Taxes

The following article appeared in a recent issue of *The Transport News*, a publication in the interests of truckmen.

The following letter, written by a prominent transport operator in British Columbia, was recently received by the editor and is reproduced here because of its general interest to transport operators in other provinces:

"It was with great interest that the writer read your article 'Problems of Transportation' in the February issue of your paper. We, that are engaged in the transport business to the interior of British Columbia, are faced with a problem of taxation that we believe no operators elsewhere in Canada or the United States are faced with.

"We realize that highway transport has reached a much higher state of development in Ontario than in the other provinces, and the purpose of our writing is to ask that you advise us of rates on toll bridges and toll roads in the Province of Ontario. We may state that at the present time B.C. operators are negotiating with the Provincial Government for a substantial reduction of the Cariboo Highway road toll.

"Before explaining our road tolls, just let us explain our part in the transport industry here. We are operating two large trucks between Vancouver and the Cariboo interior on a weekly schedule. Our return trip each week totals 1070 miles via the trans-provincial and Cariboo highways.

"The Cariboo Highway road toll is collected for the use of the Fraser Canyon section of the road. This section of the highway is 60 miles in length. The rate charged is \$1.00 for the first 4000 pounds, and 10 cents per cwt. on the balance of the gross weight of a truck. Our trucks, when loaded northbound, weigh 25,200 pounds, and in consequence we pay \$22.20 to use the highway. If fully loaded on the return trip we pay the same amount, viz., \$45.00 return. If both our trucks are loaded northbound and southbound we pay the Provincial Department of Works \$90 per week.

"This toll has been charged six months of the year, but we are advised lately that it is to become an annual levy. In addition, we pay 7 cents per gallon on the 15,000 gallons of gasoline we consume during the operating season, besides \$460.00 for our freight and vehicle licences. "After reading the foregoing we are quite certain that you have no form of extortion in Ontario to equal ours in B.C."

It was with no little feeling of relief that the British Columbia operator was advised that there were no toll roads or toll bridges in Ontario, with the exception of the International bridges between Canada and the United States. Based on a hauling season of six months (26 weeks) in the year, the above taxes amount to approximately \$3920.00—certainly no small amount to pay for the operation of two trucks. If similar conditions exist elsewhere in Canada operators in that province are invited to express their opinions, politely of course, to *Transport News*.—(Ed. Note).

### HOUSING ACT PROMISES MUCH BUILDING ACTIVITY

able rates to people in the low earning class. Annual rental from such developments must not exceed 20 per cent of the total income of the tenant. No family whose income exceeds five times the economic rental of the unit will be eligible for tenancy. In this way it is planned to ensure that the benefits of this housing project are reserved for the low-income group.

In addition, municipally operated housing projects must be backed by a guarantee from the Provincial Government, and the municipality must guarantee that taxes on low rental houses will not exceed one per cent annually the cost of the project while money remains owing the Dominion Government.

Private corporations building low-rental units under this plan will be required to make an agreement to sell out to the municipality for the amount of capital invested. Known as limited dividend companies, these corporations cannot pay more than five per cent per year on their investment, and the agreement to sell for the capital eliminates any possibility of accretion of capital.

The new bill was released approximately \$100,000,000 for home building in Canada, with consequent stimulus to industry and commerce generally through the distribution of wages and purchase of materials throughout the Dominion.
