The Outlook for Gold Mining in the Cariboo

Generally speaking the present position is that in both lode-gold and placer mining increasing activity is apparent throughout the Cariboo district. While there are doubtless contributory causes, it cannot be questioned that the chief reason for this activity lies in the fact that the district has justified the confidence placed in it.

In lode-gold mining the results accomplished by the two producing companies, Cariboo Gold Quartz Mining Co. Ltd. and Island Mountain Mines Co. Ltd. during the past few years are widely known and speak for themselves. At the property of Cariboo Hudson Gold Mines Ltd. and at that of Quesnelle Quartz Mining Co. Ltd. developments have been such as to encourage the owners to construct milling plants.

In placer mining, the larger operations, namely, Bullion Placers Ltd. and Lowhee Mining Co. Ltd., coupled with the success gained by many of the smaller operators, have been the means of encouraging effort in, and drawing attention to this branch of the mining industry. It is a noteworthy fact, that in spite of being closely prospected for placer for over seventy-five years, the district still offers to the prospector reasonable chance of new discovery. Indeed, hardly a year passes without some evidence of this—a tribute not only to the widespread occurrence of placer, but also to the intelligent effort of the prospector. Further, the many river bars within the district offer to the experienced placer miner the possibility of earning a "grub-stake" by dint of hard work.

Although the placer occurrence may be widespread, field-study demonstrates that certain parts of the district are more promising than others. The interdependence of lode-gold and placer occurrence is well illustrated in the district, and this relationship has not been obliterated, although it may have been somewhat obscured by glaciation. It follows that recognition of the geographic recognition of the gold belts is of importance both from the lode-gold and placer standpoints.

In the Annual Report of the Minister of Mines for 1933 was published a general account of the gold belts of the district, together with a map. Nothing has transpired in the interim sensibly to modify views therein expressed, save that knowledge of the gold belts has been greatly enriched by the field studies and reports of officers of the Bureau of Geology and Topography of the Federal Department of Mines and Resources.

In the Annual Report of the Minister of Mines aforementioned attention was drawn to the likely promise of a strip of country bordering the contact between the Pre-cambrian and Mesozoic rocks, and very approximately indicated by the region on either side of a line joining Wingdam and Likely. Recent departmental field notes in one part of the region mentioned has brought to light a fact of interest and possible importance from the dredging standpoint. It has been ascertained that the upper part of the Cottonwood River valley is extensively underlain by indurated glacial deposits of presumably in-glacial age. Over this indurated material which forms an excellent false bed-rock, the post-glacial waters have swept, effecting thereon a concentration of gold. While it is clear that systematic testing is necessary to determine if dredging possibilities are present, favorable features such as comparatively shallow depth to this false bed-rock and the suitable character of the latter for dredging are apparent. It is possible that a similar indurated false bed-rock underlies the lower portions of the Swift River valley. It is understood that the construction of a hydroelectric plant on the Cariboo River (Swamp River) for the distribution and sale of electric power throughout the district is still under consideration by certain interests.

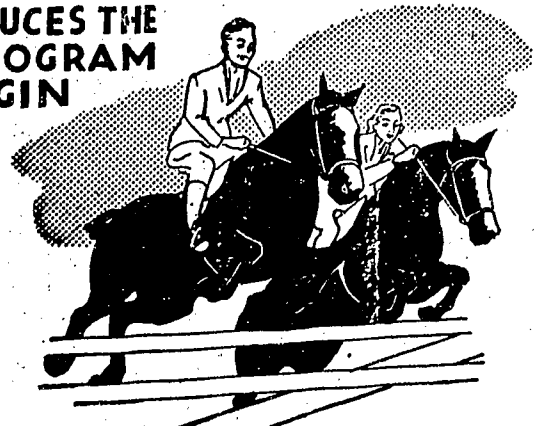

**CARIBOO'S GREATEST NEED
SETTLEMENT, SAYS MINISTER**

(Continued from page one)

European coast. "In the next war we will all be in the trenches," this man prophesied.

Living conditions in the British Isles are difficult because of over-population—in Canada the same difficult conditions exist because of lack of population. The speaker pointed to the great central interior of this province as an example. We have tremendous natural resources and not population to take advantage of them—some of the best farm lands, mining resources of all kinds, fisheries, stands of fine timber, etc. In Canada, and the United States, people of all nationalities live at peace under one flag, and both countries are setting an example to hate-ridden Europe. "Why not encourage immigration?" the minister asked.

The whole matter of world unrest, he said, was not based on the different types of banking, on different religious creeds and practices, or different modes of living, but rather, on congested living conditions in various nations, causing lean stomachs and consequent unrest. "People," he said, will fight before they will starve."

In closing his address Mr. Gardiner made a plea to the young people in the audience. When there were not sufficient jobs to go around, he said, why, after being graduated from university, sit around and do nothing? Why not, instead, take any job that offers?—a job in the mines; a job in the forests; a job in the fisheries. These jobs must be done, and if a man has the courage, he can work his way to the top in any profession or trade. Let Canadians, or British, take these jobs while they offer, was his advice.

With Mr. Gardiner on the speaker's platform were J. G. Turgeon, M.P., Mark Connelly, M.L.A. for Omicra, H. G. Perry, M.L.A. for Ft. George, and Louis LeBourdais, M.L.A. for the Cariboo. All gave short addresses of welcome to Mr. Gardiner. John Holt, J. P., acted as chairman and introduced the speakers.

The consensus of opinion of Cariboo people, who listened with great interest to Mr. Gardiner's address, is that the Minister of Agriculture's trip through this section is linked with that made by a British delegation which looked over the country two weeks ago with the idea of settling 10,000 British on the central interior farm lands.

Messrs. Gardiner, Turgeon and LeBourdais left Tuesday morning by car for Williams Lake and Canim Lake, where meetings were held that day.
