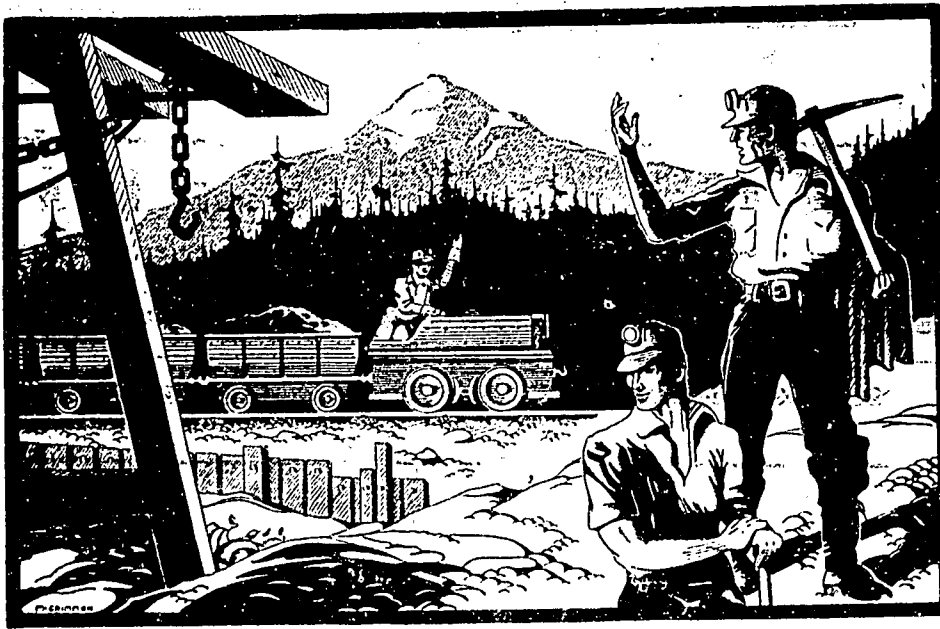

THE HOUSEWIFE

FILL THE COOKIE JAR

The following recipes will make welcome additions to old cookie favorites. By using butter as shortening cookies will have not only a delicious and palatable flavor, but will be of high food value.

Spice Drops—

3-4 cup butter
1-2 cups brown sugar
2 eggs, unbeaten
Pinch of salt
1-2 cups pastry flour
1-2 teaspoon cinnamon
3-4 cup raisins
3-4 cup nuts
1 teaspoon soda
Vanilla
Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs, dry ingredients sifted together, raisins, nuts and vanilla. Drop by spoonfuls on buttered baking sheet and bake in moderate oven about ten minutes.

Butter Wafer—
3-4 cup brown sugar
1 cup melted butter
1 egg
1-2 cups pastry flour
1-2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1-2 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon vanilla
Add butter to brown sugar. Add unbeaten egg. Beat well. Add dry sifted ingredients and vanilla. Drop by spoonfuls on unbuttered baking sheet. Bake 4 to 5 minutes at 350 degrees F.

Butterscotch Cookies—
1 cup brown sugar
1-2 cup butter
1 egg
1 teaspoon vanilla
1-2 cups pastry flour
1 scant teaspoon soda
1-4 teaspoon salt
1-2 cup chopped walnuts (may be omitted)
Cream butter and sugar and well-beaten egg. Add vanilla and sifted dry ingredients and nuts. Form into rolls. Wrap in wax paper and chill in refrigerator. When required slice in thin slices and bake 8 to 10 minutes.
