**Ration Books Distributed September 12, 13, 14**

Ration book time is drawing near. The new Book No. 6 will be distributed in Quesnel on the days of Thursday, Friday and Saturday, September 12, 13 and 14, at the Court House. Make sure you know where you may obtain your book and, at what hours the volunteer workers will be in attendance to give it to you. Posters about Quesnel will give the hours of distribution.

There is a special reason for not being late this time. If you do not get your book on the advertised dates you may have to wait until September 30. It is well to remember that on September 19 Book No. 6 will come into use, and on that date five sugar-preserves coupons will become valid and also a meat coupon. Again, on September 26 a butter coupon and meat coupon will become valid out of the new book.

**HELP THE VOLUNTEERS**

One of the greatest examples of public service in Canada has been the distribution of the ration books in recent years. With the exception of the first book this has been done by volunteers who have given their time to this form of public service. There are 600 local ration boards in Canada, of which 54 are in British Columbia, and it is the public spirit of thousands of British Columbia citizens which makes it possible to distribute the books with a minimum of red tape.

The ration administration of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, therefore urges the public to go to their distributing centres early with their green card RB 191 properly filled in, and co-operate with their fellow citizens across the table who are giving out the books.

**NEW RATION BOOK**

The new Ration Book No. 6 has a yellow cover. The coupon design is smaller than previously used. In the new book are two sheets of sugar coupons, two sheets of butter coupons, two sheets of meat coupons and three spare sheets. In designing and producing the new ration book precautions have been taken to make counterfeiting highly dangerous, if not impossible.

**TO HELP SHORTAGES**

Now that the hunting season is approaching a great many American hunters and tourists will visit this country. It is permissible for these visitors to bring in rationed goods: that is, butter and sugar, bacon, etc. Many of these visitors are not aware of this ruling until after they arrive, but it is hoped that those in the know will help out the shortage in Canada by bringing supplies of these goods in short supply as far as is possible.
