Thor Hermann, who is one of the engineers on the Government's Elk River power project, arrived home last night to spend the holiday here with his family.

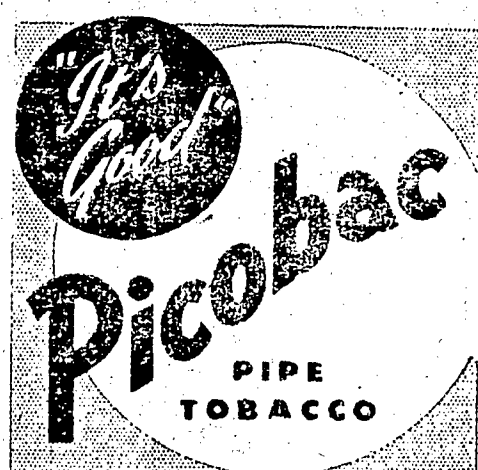

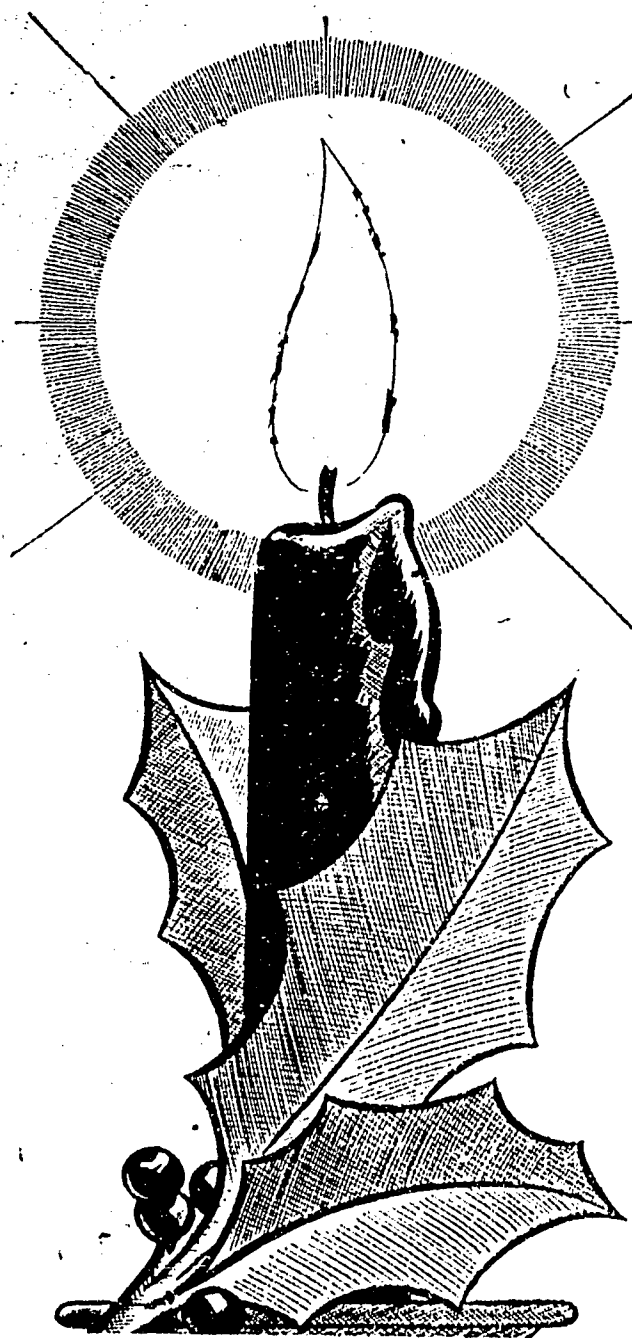
