**Mine Delegation Asks Tax Removal**

VICTORIA.—Painting a gloomy picture of mounting costs in the provincial mining industry, a delegation of mining operators has asked the B.C. Cabinet to remove the two per cent mineral tax (amounting to \$1,000,000 a year) on the grounds it amounts to dual taxation.

This comes about, they claimed, because of the Dominion-Provincial taxation agreements under which Ottawa collects all income taxes and returns B.C. a fixed amount each year (roughly \$21,000,000).

Before the tax agreement went into effect mining companies were allowed to charge the mineral tax against prepayment of their provincial income taxes.

"That is finished now," said A. S. Baillie, of Granby Consolidated, president of the Mining Association.

"We have to pay both the mineral tax and the income tax."

"We contend the mineral tax is included in the \$21,000,000 the government gets from Ottawa. So the provincial tax should be wiped out."

The two per cent tax, levied in B.C. for many years, is placed on the gross value of production at the mine portal. It is part of the province's recovery from the natural resource of minerals.

Along with Mr. Baillie in an interview with the Cabinet were heads of most of B.C.'s largest mining companies, including C. P. Browning of Britannia, A. E. Jukes of Sheep Creek, Dr. H. T. James of Island Mountain, and G. A. Wallinger and F. L. Hallam of Consolidated Mining & Smelting.

They said the dual two per cent tax is "another straw on the camel's back" of mounting costs that present a precarious future for mining.

Higher labor costs and expenses for materials are cutting down profit margins in other divisions Mr. Baillie said.

**PLANNING for TOMORROW'S FARMING**

**INCREASED YIELDS FROM PHOSPHATE FERTILIZER**

A recent review of experiments extending over 47 years, shows that yields of crops at the Dominion Experimental Farm at Agassiz, B.C., have been increased nearly one-third by the use of phosphate fertilizers, says Bruce Dickson of that Station.

The most striking results have always been obtained with mangels. In one experiment lasting four years, the superphosphate was applied at the rates of 0,300,600 and 920 pounds per acre. The resulting yields were 5.20, 9.20, 13.80 and 15.80 tons per acre. The last yield represents an increase of 200 per cent above the yield when no phosphate was used. Experiments on mangels covered a total period

of 16 years, and on the average over this period the yield increased 151 per cent when 600 pounds or more of superphosphate was used.

Experiments with superphosphate on oats, stretching back to the beginning of the century, have shown a fairly consistent increase of about 35 per cent. Seven years' work on potatoes revealed that the yield of this crop increased by 28 per cent above the yield when no phosphate fertilizer was applied.

In a three year corn experiment, the superphosphate was applied at 0.400 and 800 lbs. per acre. The average yields of corn green matter from these treatments were 14.7, 15.4 and 16.4 tons per acre.

The wild white clover crop has also responded to phosphates but to a lesser extent than the other crops.

In several instances it was found that phosphates applied for one crop had no effect on the succeeding crop a year later, but this has been found true for other fertilizer elements as well.

These carefully recorded experiments have shown phosphate to be

the most valuable fertilizer element at Agassiz, although the other two, nitrogen and potash, have also proved useful. The results do not necessarily apply to all of the soil types in the Fraser Valley, but similar experiments in other parts of the valley are now being conducted.

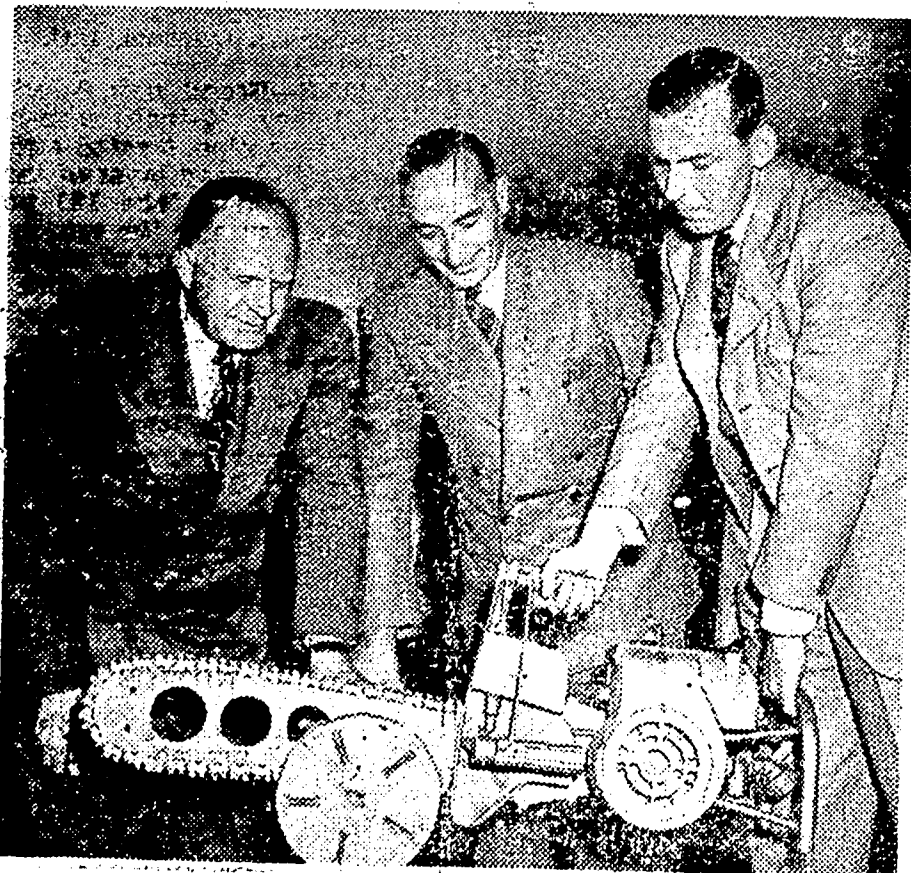

**Buyer From Norway Tests Power Saw**

In a deal that has aroused wide interest in logging and allied industries throughout Canada, an order for more than \$200,000 in power saws and parts has just been completed between Erling Angel Jersin of Norway and Power Machinery Ltd. of Vancouver. Power Machinery Ltd. is a Vancouver firm established when a group of Western Canadians went to work on research and experimentation to produce something new in a practical and efficient light weight One Man Power Chain Saw.

More than 500 of the saws comprise this initial purchase for use on the steep, wooded slopes along the fjords of south and southeastern Norway. Mr. Jersin forecasts future purchases of 6,000 because of the growing importance of the timber and pulpwood industries in Norway and the country's vital need of lumber for export. When the power saws are put

to work in the forests of Norway, it will mark the first occasion the Norwegian timber industry has ever used them. Mr. Jersin bases his prediction that the use of this type of saw will increase in Norway because of his express belief that it best meets the actual needs peculiar to his country.

All of the first purchase were the P.M. "One-Man" Power Chain Saw developed by Power Machinery Ltd of Vancouver and now being sold throughout Canada and the world. Cast magnesium is used in all castings except cylinder blocks and those few pieces where hard wearing bearing surfaces are required. It is specially designed for lightness, and three models weighing only 34, 35 or 36 pounds depending upon lengths of cutter bars which are 14, 20 and 26 inches. Each model has been balanced to provide a minimum of strain on the operator.

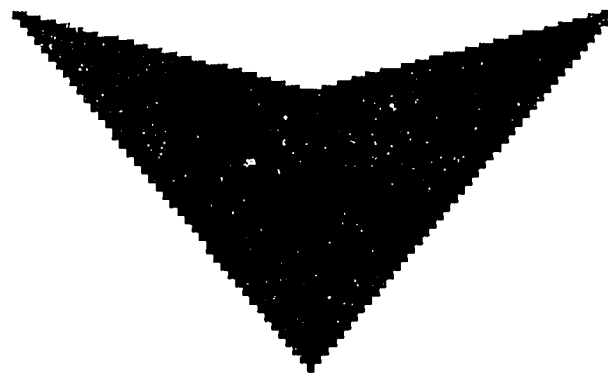
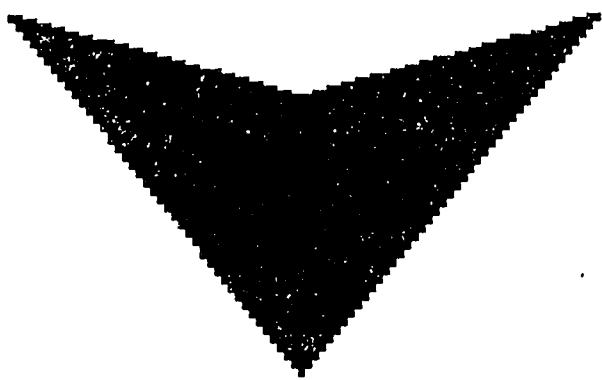
